SOUL

A fixed number of souls emanated at creation. They are stored in the 'ozar haneshomos," the depository of the souls, awaiting admission into mortal life. Each soul will in due time enter a mortal form and will after the completion of its mission be in celestial bliss. Yet a new soul does not necessarily come to life with every new birth. Many old souls are in circulation. These had erred in their previous missions and were thus at departure from their earthly vessels barred from admission into their heavenly abode. They were sentenced to one or many births and were enjoyed to correct errors committed in a previous existence. A strengthening of the moral course will therefore enable both the return of old souls to their abode and the coming into life of many new souls.

Kabbalah's doctrine of the soul, especially in its transmigratory phase, explains many apparent inexplicable life situations. Why do the righteous suffer and the wicked prosper? Why the infiltration of evil in a world that emanated from an all wise and merciful Creator? Why are innocent children afflicted or sentenced to premature death? To these the Kabbalah answers: The prosperity of the wicked is due to some virtue practiced in a previous life following which the wicked will be doomed to a harsh but cleansing transmigratory process. The suffering of the righteous comes as atonement for sins committed in a previous life following which they are destined for everlasting happiness—blissful residence in the source whence they emanated. Evil is not a positive element but an indication of the absence of the moral good. It can be banished by the increase of light. Evil at best is but a challenge for the exercise of the


Make Seder Reservations Immediately

State and Religion

As the prestige of democracy has grown, together with its mass enlightenment, greater opposition has been displayed on the part of the powerful vested interests of the Church. This attitude of opposition is in reality a direct negation of the eternal aims and principles as displayed in our own Jewish faith and in the Christian religion as well.

As the spirit of progressive democracy moves forward, there follows a greater hope for the fulfillment of our religious dreams, such as those expressed by Malachi—"Have we not all on father." The advance of democracy in itself brings forth a powerful religious message — that of the sympathetic understanding of one's fellowman.

In this unique way does democracy implant a spiritual and religious doctrine into the souls of its constituents. It would be most unwise to foster a more direct relationship by compelling the democratic state to teach specific religious principles. The State and Religious education should travel their own road alone, as long as they travel in the same direction.

212th COMMANDMENT Man Should Fear His Mother and Father by Rabbi Herbert S. Goldstein

We read in Leviticus, Chapter 19, Verse 3, "Ye shall fear every man his mother and his father." The Sifrah asked the question, "What is meant by fear and reverence?", and the answer is, One should not sit in their places or speak preceding them and one should not contradict them." "Honor" is shown by providing for their food, drink, dress and other requirements.

In my "Bible Comments for Home Reading," you will find the following comment upon this verse. The term "man" used in this connection does not exclude "woman," for the verb used is the second person plural "Ye shall fear." The reason the term "man" is used, is because it is not

always possible for the woman (on account of marriage) to do her full duty by her parents. (See Talmud Kiddushin 30b).

The Rabbis point out that since one is apt to fear the father more than the mother, because he is the stricter of the two, the Torah places the mother first, and says, "Ye shall fear every man his MOTHER and his father." On the other hand one is apt to honor the mother more than the father, because the father is less popular with his children in view of the fact that he is usually srticter, and then too his love is not as demonstrative as the mother's, therefore the Bible, in regard to honoring the parents, places the father before the mother as we read in Exodus Chapter 20, Verse 12, "Honor thy FATHER and thy mother."

However, the parents, if they so desire may forego the honor due them.

It is also interesting to note that one who strikes his father or his mother is put to death by strangulation whilst on the other hand if he curses his father or his mother his death penalty is severer, namely by stoning. The reason for this being that striking is a physical sin whilst cursing is a spiritual sin. Therefore for the latter the punishment is greater.

spiritual will of the soul and thus can become a basis for the good. And lastly there may be some people who because of their past sinful record are allowed but a peep into mortal living and must immediately pass out of life to continue in their transmigratory process.

In the long run, with the moral course on the ascendancy, all souls will see mortal life and will return cleansed and invigorated to their abode — the "ozar haneshomos." When that will happen the great millenium will be on hand. The universe will dissolve and G-d alone will reign in the vastness of space. Then perhaps a new creation will be set in motion. Other powers of the "ein sof" will emanate and a new universe and perhaps a new humanity will be fashioned. It is to this new order that the Psalmist hints when he states: Of old didst Thou lay the foundations of the earth, and the heavens are the handiwork of Thy hands. They shall perish but Thou shalt endure yea, all of them shall wax old like a garment as a vesture Thou shalt change them and they shall pass away. But Thou art the self-same and Thy years shall have no end. (Ps. 102:26-28)
