380th OF THE 613 BIBLICAL COMMANDMENTS Concerning the Observance of the Second Passover on the 14th Day of Iyar.

If one was unable to observe Passover at the proper time (on the 14th day of Nissan) because of ritual uncleanness or because he was on a journey, far away from Jerusalem, he was to perform it, a month later, on the 14th day of Iyar, as it is said in the Book of Numbers, Chapter 9, verse 10, "Speak unto the Children of Israel, saying, if any man of you or of your posterity shall be unclean by reason of a dead body, or be on a journey afar off, yet he shall keep the Passover unto the Lord, on the 14th day of the second month at even, they shall keep it." Our Sages said that, even if one unwittingly or purposely was prevented from offering the pascal lamb on the first Passover, namely,

on the 14th day of Nissan, he was permitted to bring it on the Second Passover, namely, the 14th day of Iyar. The purpose of the commandment is to indicate to us that the laws concerning Passover are so strong in our historic fabric that we cannot fail to observe them. For Passover, the Holy One, blessed be He, performed for us miracles and great wonders. He went out of His way to change the natural order of events before the eyes of many nations. Passover is an indication of the Almighty G-d and of His Providence. How He led the people from Egypt and split the Red Sea for them, and gave them the heavenly Manna, for forty years, day by day, except on the Sabbath. On the sixth day, two portions were sent down to cover the needs of the Sabbath. In order to make Israel worthy to carry out this worthwhile commandment concerning the observance of the Passover, nothing was to stand in the way of its performance. When it could not be observed at the proper time, namely on the 14th day of Nissan, it was to be observed in the second month of the year, in Iyar, on the 14th day. This included also one who became a proselyte between the First Passover and the Second Passover, and also a minor who became 13 years old and one day, between both Passovers. They were also obliged to carry out the Second Passover.

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YOSEF YITZCHAAK SCHNEIRSON (Lubavitcher Rebbe)

The next morning a check was received from him to start the work for homes for children in Israel. In this country his name was synonymous with goodness.

He understood our own American environment through his textbooks. They are exceptionally pedagogically sound.

We hope and pray that a new leader might arise to carry on with the same sincerity, simplicity and zeal, the motivating principles of his activities. May the memory of this righteous man always serve as a blessing.

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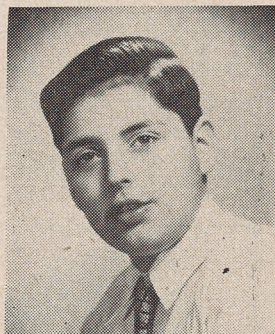
