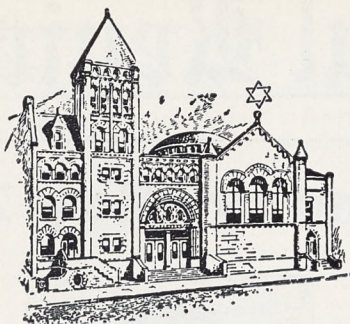

**390th OF THE 613  
BIBLICAL COMMANDMENTS  
'A Stranger Shall Not Serve  
In The Sanctuary.'**

By Rabbi Herbert S. Goldstein

A stranger, (one who is not of the seed of Aaron), shall not serve in the Sanctuary, as it is said in Numbers, Chapter 18, verse 4, "And a stranger shall not draw near unto you." This injunction is repeated in another way in the Book of Numbers, Chapter 18, verse 22, "Neither must the children of Israel come right unto the Tabernacle of the Congregation lest they bear sin." This prohibition involves only the actual offering of the sacrifice and all the particular functions that are specially reserved for the priest, as for instance the receiving of the blood and the sprinkling thereof, the pouring of the oil, etc. If they were performed by the laity the offering was "posul", unfit. However, there are certain services that the laity were permitted to perform, as for instance, the slaughtering of the animal, the bringing of the

**391st OF THE 613  
BIBLICAL COMMANDMENTS  
'Not To Annul the Guarding  
of the Sanctuary.'**

We are always to guard the Sanctuary. We are to have watchmen surround it every night, as we read in the Book of Numbers, Chapter 8, verse 5, "And ye shall keep watch over the Sanctuary." Our Rabbis say that whenever it is said, "hishamer," be careful, or "pen" or "v'al" they are used to introduce a negative commandment. We have, therefore, two commandments concerning the guarding of the Temple. First, the 388th Commandment, which is a positive one, as we read in the Book of Numbers, Chapter 18, verse 3, "And they shall watch over the Tabernacle of the Congregation." This is in the third person. Our commandment is the imperative second person, which says, "and ye shall keep watch over the Sanctuary," which is a negative commandment.

The purposes of these commandments are, as we have said before, (1) to protect the Tabernacle from unwanted intrusions, and (2) to raise the dignity of the Sanctuary and to increase reverence for it.

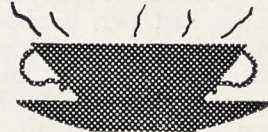
