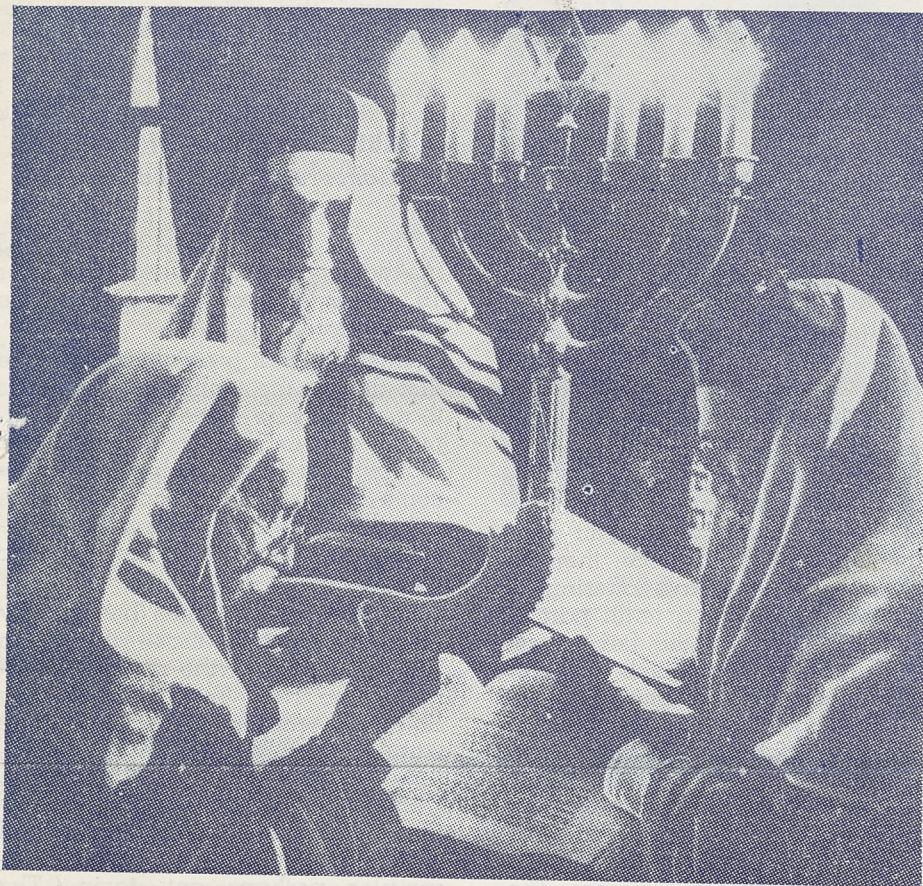

ROSH HASHONA NOTES

At sundown Monday night, Jews throughout the world will usher in the Jewish New Year. Rosh Hashona is called in the Bible, "Yom Hazikoron", The Day of Remembrance — when the acts of individuals and entire nations are remembered by the Almighty. It is a time for serious deliberation of our deeds during the past year. The observance of Rosh Hashona lasts two full days.

Shofar

The most significant and awe inspiring ceremony is the sounding of the Shofar. The clear and sharp notes of the Shofar arouse the inner soul of the Jew to better himself before G-d and man.

New Year Greetings

Jews greet each other with the traditional blessing of **Leshonah Tovah Tikasevu**, "May You Be Inscribed in the BOOK OF LIFE." On Rosh Hashona G-d inscribes the fate of each individual and on Yom Kippur it is sealed.

Bread in Honey

Whereas throughout the entire year the "Hamotzi" is dipped in salt, on Rosh Hashona, Yom Kippur Eve

and Sukkos, it is dipped into honey to symbolize the coming of a sweet year.

Tzom Gedaliah

The day after Rosh Hashona (Thursday) is observed as a Fast Day commemorating the assassination of Gedaliah, the last Jewish Governor after the destruction of the Temple.

Tashlich

On the first day after Mincha, it is customary to go to a river or stream to recite the Tashlich prayer. "Tashlich" is derived from the first word of the verse, "Thou shalt cast all their sins into the depths of the sea."

Ten Days of Penitence

The ten days from Rosh Hashona to Yom Kippur are known as the Ten Days of Penitence. It is an opportune time for prayer and penance for sins. Special prayers, called Slichot, are said during these days in which we ask forgiveness, and solemnly resolve to accept the Torah Laws as our way of life for the future.

396th OF THE 613 BIBLICAL COMMANDMENTS

"The Levites Are To Give A Tithe of Their Tithe."

The Levites were commanded to separate a tithe from the tithe which they received from the Israelites. They are, in turn, to give that tithe to the priests, for it is written in the Book of Numbers, Chapter 18, verse 26, "Thus speak unto them, when ye take of the children of Israel the tithe which I have given you from them, for your inheritance, then ye shall offer up a heave offering of it for the L-rd, even a tenth part of the tithe." All that the Levites received from the Israelites was regarded as if it came from his own soil. Therefore, he had to give the tenth part of this to the priest. Then he and his family were permitted to consume the remainder without any restriction as to place and Levitical purity. This tithe is called in the Talmud "Trumat Ma'sser,—The Heave Offering of the Tithe," and in the Bible it is called "Trumat-Hashem," "the Heave Offering of the L-rd." One is to give of the best and the choicest, as it is written in

the Book of Numbers, Chapter 18, verse 29, "of all the best therein." From this we learn the negative part, namely that if one gives of the inferior part, he commits a SIN.

This commandment prevailed only in Israel and when most of the Israelites dwelt therein.

397th OF THE 613 BIBLICAL COMMANDMENTS Concerning the Red Heifer I

The Israelites were commanded in the Book of Numbers, Chapter 19, verse 2, "that they bring Thee a red heifer."

This was first promulgated on the first day of the month of Nissan, so that those who were levitically impure—due to having come in contact with a dead body—might become pure, by means of the ashes from the red heifer, and thus be enabled to participate in the Passover sacrifice.

Why do these ashes both purify the unclean and make the clean impure, is one of the many mysteries of the Holy Torah. Even King Solomon, when reflecting upon the statute of the Red Heifer, exclaimed, "This is far from me." Ecclesiastes, Chapter 7, verse 23. I have often thought about this mystery and I should like to propose that it resembles perhaps anti-toxin. The toxin makes the person sick and the same toxin, injected into the sick person makes him well. So also there are herbs that will both induce and reduce fever.

To My Beloved Congregants:

It is with mingled feelings of joy and thanksgiving that I am able to report to you, that the establishment of a Children's Village, to accommodate one hundred children, was made possible through the generous gifts of the members and worshippers of the West Side Institutional Synagogue. The Village is known as **שְׂדֵי חֶמֶד** "Seday Chemed", which means "Pleasant Field". It is situated in "Nachlat Jehudah", about five minutes away from the famous colony, "Rishon L'Zion", on the road to Tel Aviv. It consists of seven buildings for dormitory purposes and a structure which houses a Synagogue and Study-room, a large dining-room (used also as a social hall) and a kitchen. In addition it has a laundry, a hennery of 800 chickens (two thousand are to be added soon), and a stall for six cows which have already been purchased. A calf was born on the premises recently. The Village covers an area of 48 dunam, about one-half of which is used for vegetable plantations. Soon "Seday Chemed" will come into possession of a four ton truck, the gift of Mr. and Mrs. Siegfried Bendheim, who were in Israel this summer.

In the rooms of some of the buildings there are plaques bearing the names of those who have pledged one thousand dollars towards this project. These include Dr. Benjamin Goldstein's family, Mr. and Mrs. Louis Katz, Mr. and Mrs. Ben Glazer, Mr. David H. Gluck, Mr. Daniel Reisman, and Mr. Julius Golding.

Everyone who has visited the W.S.I.S. Children's Village has been

deeply impressed by the happy looks on the faces of the refugee and orphaned children who have been placed in our care by the "Youth Aliyah." The children are busy in the fields, or with the livestock, one half of the day, and devote the other half of the day to secular and religious studies. The boys will soon be taught the printing trade by means of the machines, which have been promised to us by the Shraga Foundation. The girls will be taught sewing and dress-making with the help of the electric sewing machines which we hope to secure for them. In short, the children of our Village will be prepared to become self-respecting re-

ligious Jews and Jewesses.

Our Congregation is, as far as I know, the first Congregation in the United States to establish a Children's Village in Israel.

May the Almighty privilege the West Side Institutional Synagogue to continue to do constructive work both in the United States and in Israel.

EXCERPTS FROM THE DIARY OF MRS. HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN FROM ISRAEL, 5710-1950

9:30 A.M., Friday Morning, May 12, 1950

HURRAH! I am sitting on deck looking at HAIFA. Land has just come into sight! Beautiful Mt. Carmel, which the Bible associates so dramatically, with Elijah the Prophet. (Editors Note: See Book of Kings I, Chapter XVIII.

We're approaching the harbor. It is full of boats. Here I can read the letters on them. They are all Hebrew. It is so much simpler than it was trying to figure out the Greek inscriptions on the boats, in the port of Piraeus.

We're pulling into the wharf. Crowds of people are standing, waiting and waving. We're looking for

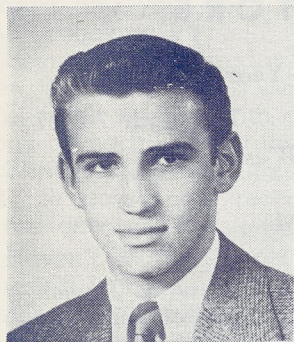

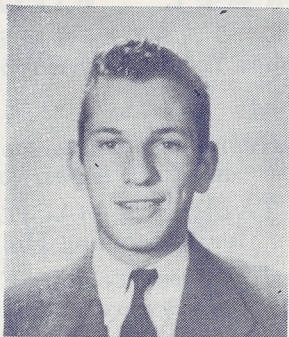

Naomi and you can imagine how she is looking for us!

Seems like yesterday we were here last. Yes, this is Israel. Beautiful white houses, with a little balcony on each story of the house.

Shrieks of delight—tears of joy—as the passengers recognize their loved ones on the shore.

Haven't spotted Naomi yet, but I guess it won't be long now. We're getting closer and closer to the pier. It takes a long time for the boat to pull in.

11 A.M.—In The Customs House at Haifa

Out of deference for my wheelchair, I was the first one off the boat.

At the foot of the gangplank stood Naomi with both her arms wide open to receive us.

There are moments of emotion which are better left undescribed. Suffice it to say, that our reunion, in Israel, meant more than words can tell.

We will leave Haifa shortly for Jerusalem—a four hour ride—and we look forward to spending SHAB-BAT in Jerusalem.

Friday, May 19th, 1950

We have had many callers. Each visitor brings a little news of what is going on in the country, and each one colors the news in accordance with his or her own opinion and political point of view. All religious people are agreed, however, that it is essential to get the religious children out of the transit camps, as soon as possible. As you may have heard, the government of Israel and the "Youth Aliyah" pay for the education of all children, but the parents have the privilege of choosing if the children should be sent to religious or irreligious schools. (Talk about democracy and freedom!! It is really carried out here.) Naturally, religious parents want their children to go to religious schools and to religious settlements and children's homes. The great influx of North African and Yemenite Jews during the last year, are predominantly orthodox, and the resources of the orthodox groups here are not adequate, at present, to take care of all these children. So, the sum and substance of it all is that large sums of money are required to cure this distressing situation.
