EXCERPTS FROM THE DIARY OF MRS. HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN FROM ISRAEL, 5710-1950

Jerusalem, 1 o'clock, Thursday, June 1

We were lulled to sleep last night by the soothing rhythm of the waves of the Mediterranean and woke up feeling rested and refreshed. Part of this feeling was due to the fact that we had taken full advantage of what is a luxury to us Jerusalemites—hot running water.

After a full and satisfying breakfast at the Hotel, this morning, we started homeward bound. As it was dark when we reached Herzliya-by-the-Sea, last night, we did not realize what a beautiful town this is.—It is completely residential and has many attractive new-looking houses in it.

The neighboring community — Bnei Brak—has both factories and private houses. This is a completely religious community. Its gates are closed on Shabbos and no one is admitted by car, except a doctor. Looks like the children are not neglected here, for they have big circus grounds, and something that strongly resembled our Merry-go-Rounds.

Next we came to Ramat Gan, which is also a combination residential and factory town. Here you cannot look in any direction without seeing houses in the process of construction. They are even building a Stadium. They are modern and progressive.

As we drove into Tel Aviv, at about 10 o'clock this morning, we saw before us a busy, bustling, pulsating mass of humanity. Everybody and everything seemed to be in a state of motion. There was nothing static in that atmosphere. Khaki shorts and shirts seemed to be the height of fashion. At least, that is what the majority of men wore. There were not many bearded men in sight. They probably choose the less materialistic atmosphere of Jerusalem if they can help it.

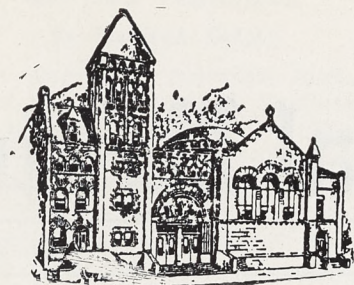

404th OF THE 613
BIBLICAL COMMANDMENTS
"To Bring The Musaph Offering
On The Day Of Pentecost."

The Israelites were commanded to bring the Additional Offering, the Musaph Offering, on the Festival of Shevuoth, which is on the 6th day of the month of Sivan, as it is written in the Book of Numbers, Chapter 28, verse 26, "Also on the Day of the First Fruits, when ye bring a new meal-offering unto the L-rd. . . " Verse 31, "ye shall offer them beside the continual burnt offering." We have discussed this matter of the Musaph before, namely, that the additional offering was to lend additional inspiration on the Sabbath and on the Festivals.

GETTING TO KNOW
MAIMONIDES

Young men and women over 17 are cordially invited to attend the first of a series of sessions on the teachings of Maimonides, tonight, October 20th, at the home of Rabbi Reichel, 135 West 84th Street, Apt.

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29, verse 1, "And on the seventh month, on the first day of the month, ye shall have a holy convocation. Ye shall do no servile work יום תרועה Yom-Truah, "it is a day of blowing the trumpets".

According to tradition, the first day of the seventh month, the month of Tishri, is the day Adam and Eve sinned by eating of the forbidden fruit. This day has been designated for all times as the Day of Judgment.

It is interesting to note that the planet for this month in the Zodiac circle, is a scale, a symbol for judgment. During the month of Tishri man's deeds are weighed in the balance and his life for the coming year is accordingly determined.

Rosh Hashanah is also a day for the blowing of the ram's horn, reminding us of the great sacrifice, both father Abraham and his son Isaac, were prepared to make to carry out the command of the Almighty.

If the first day of Rosh Hashanah falls on Sabbath, we do not blow the shofar on the day, but on the second day, the reason for this being that the shofar might be carried on the Sabbath, which is not permitted. This is an illustration of an example where the ends do not justify the means. It would be well if in our public endeavors, we would understand this point of view. Unfortunately, we are permitting the devil, as it were, to enter into the holiest efforts, even for synagogues, or Yeshivot. Alas, how low have we fallen!

As it sounds this first clear call for freedom, its message will be broadcast around the world and will be echoed around the world as bells of free men everywhere simultaneously join in pealing the cause of freedom.
