EXCERPTS FROM THE DIARY OF MRS. HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN FROM ISRAEL, 5710 - 1950

Monday, July 10, 1950

Perhaps I have been using ostrich-like tactics in refraining from mentioning the Korea conflict, in my letters to you. Since even the top-notch diplomats do not seem to be certain of what's what, I thought it best to avoid the subject altogether. However, it occurred to me that you might like to hear about the discussion which took place in the KNESSET, last week, on this matter.

As you probably read in the newspapers, every member of the United Nations had to make up its mind as to where it stood, in the world conflict reflected in the battles in Korea.

When this question came up before the Knesset, the Foreign Minister, Mr. Moshe Sharett, reaffirmed Israel's adherence to the principle of "non-identification with either of the contending blocs that have been formed in the world. At the same time," he added, "Israel has always upheld the preservation of peace, as a cardinal principle of its policy, and its support of the United Nations, as the main instrument for the realization of this aim. 419th OF THE 613 BIBLICAL COMMANDMENTS "To Teach the Commandments Diligently to the Children". By Rabbi Herbert S. Goldstein

It is a positive commandment to study the wisdom of the Torah and to teach it to our children; as we read in Deuteronomy, Chapter 6, verse 7, "and thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children." The Hebrew word for "thou shalt teach them diligently" is a cognate for the word "teeth". In other words, one should not superficially suggest but put "teeth" as it were, in his instruction to his children.

The words of the Torah are to be of living interest at home as well as in the study house.

To succeed in the task of teaching our children properly we ourselves must make the Torah a part of our discussions at the table.

I must give you an extract from a speech which Moshe Sharett, Israel's Foreign Minister made, in the Knesset, yesterday, in connection with the Korean situation.

Mr. Sharett said: "From this city of Jerusalem, the eternal capital of the Jewish people, from the place hallowed by the tradition of religions, from the scene of mighty spiritual struggles between justice and inequity, freedom and bondage, war and peace, from the country where the wondrous vision of rectifying an age-long injustice, has become a reality, for all to see, in the ingathering of the dispersed and the liberation of the creative spirit of an exiled and scattered people, from this country, the appeal goes out to all in whose power it is to-day to SHEATHE the sword in the Far East, to lend each other a hand, together to strive for the restoration of peace and the salvation of mankind."

teach his son the Torah? The answer is, when the child begins to speak, he should be taught certain verses of the Torah as for instance

תורה צוה לנו משה מורשה קהלת יעקב
 "The law which Moses commanded us in the heritage of the Congregation of Jacob," and also the first verse of the SH'MAH, namely שמע ישראל SH'MAH YISROEL, "Hear O Israel, the L-rd our G-d, the L-rd is One". As he gets older, he teaches him gradually other verses of the Bible. In his 6th year, he employs a teacher. Until when, is one obliged to study the Torah? The answer is until the day of his death, as it is written in the Bible, "Lest they depart from thy heart all the days of thy life." Even when one is dying, if he can, he is to study the Torah, for it is written "This is the Torah of man as he dies in the tent" (Numbers, Chapter 19 verse 14)" (Hertz).

Every one is supposed to set aside a certain period during the day and night to study the Torah, as is written in the first Psalm, "And thou shalt meditate upon it by day and night." As a matter of fact, the Talmud in Shabbos says, that after we leave this world we shall be asked a number of questions, among them are the following: "Hast thou carried on thy business honestly? Hast thou set aside certain time for the study of the Torah?"
