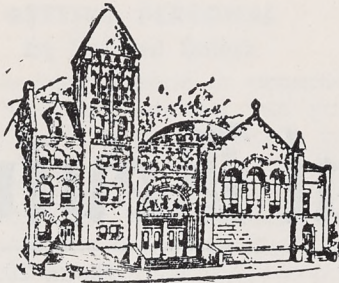

BIBLICAL COMMANDMENTSNot to Show Mercy
To the Heathens

We read in Deuteronomy, Chapter 7, verse 2, "Thou shalt not show mercy unto them". When we speak of the heathen, we speak of the ancient idolator who did not accept the seven fundamental principles of the Naachaim laws, not to rob, steal, murder, etc. However, we are commanded to feed the poor of the gentiles, as well as the poor of the Israelites.

This law prevails at all times and at all places, refers to males and females. One who trespasses it and praises idolators and their deeds, has trespassed this negative commandment. He does not receive stripes because there is no act involved.

It appears that in the Divine Scheme, a major operation had to be performed to amputate these poisonous limbs from the body politic of the world.

BIBLICAL COMMANDMENTS
Not to Intermarry

We are commanded in Deuteronomy, Chapter 7, verse 3, "Neither shalt thou make marriages with them". This refers of course to the seven heathen nations. However, in regard to the rest of the nations, if they truly and genuinely became converts, it is permissible to marry them. However, conversions as a rule are not genuine. They are **not** entered into because of the love of Judaism, but rather because of the love of some fair maiden Jewess or stalwart young Jew. Such conversion is not permissible.

Moses had previously warned the people against allying themselves by marriage with their neighbors (Exod. XXXIV, 16), and the warning was repeated by his successor Joshua (Josh. XXIII, 12). In our own days, intermarriage is no less fatal to the continued existence of Israel.

There are so many dangers fraught with intermarriage,—the instruction of the children, invitations to eat in the homes of non-Jewish relatives, which involve violations of the Dietary Laws, the subconscious feeling of the non-Jew or Jewess for his religion, the evidence of outbursts of disrespects of each other's faith when quarrels arise, and last but not least the sorrow and **premature** death brought upon the parents of either side.

The man or woman who enters into an intermarriage trespasses this law and is also to receive stripes.

**ERUV TAVSHILIN
THIS THURSDAY**

On a Jewish festival no food may be prepared from one day to the other. As next Friday is a Festival day, it is necessary to perform the ceremony of "Eruv Tavshilin", (a combination of dishes) which makes it permissible to prepare food on the festival for the Sabbath. On Thursday afternoon April 26, the master of the house should take a piece of matzoh together with some cooked food, such as meat or fish, and recite the following benediction:—

ברוך אתה ה' אלקינו מלך העולם אשר קדשנו במצותיו וצונו על מצות ערוב
"Praised be Thou, O L—d our G-d, King of the universe, who hast sanctified us by Thy commandments, and hast commanded us concerning the observance of the Eruv."

"By virtue of this 'Eruv' be it permitted unto us to bake, boil, and warm up, kindle lights, and do on the day of the Festival all that is needful for the Sabbath, we and all who dwell in this city."

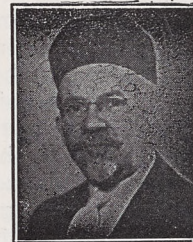
