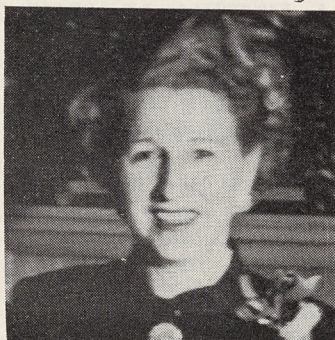

Dear friends—Israel is talking to you. It needs your money, your pledge, your help. Write in now to our Synagogue and tell us what **YOU** are going to give this year.

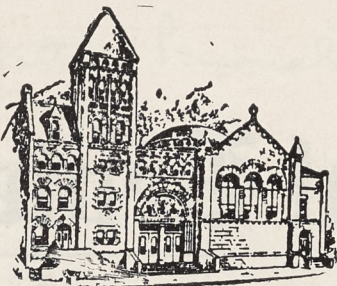

BIBLICAL COMMANDMENTS
"To Say Grace After Meals"

One is obliged to say Grace after he has eaten and has been sated, as we read in the Book of Deuteronomy, Chapter 8, verse 10, "thou shalt eat and be satisfied, and bless the L-rd, thy G-d for the good land which he hath given thee".

First of all, let us note that the good things in this world are given for man's enjoyment. One is not to feel that if he eats well, he sins. Judaism wants man to enjoy life and to be healthy, but of course not to over-eat or drink as we are bidden not to be a **זולל וסובא** "a glutton or a drunkard." G-d wants us to be well and to enjoy the good of life, to have zest to perform His commandments zealously. It is interesting to note that whilst other religions extol the nazirite, our Rabbis "call the nazirite a sinner,

נזיר נקרא חוטא שציער את עצמו מן היין "because the nazirite has to painfully withdraw himself from wine", —the good of the world.

Whilst the Bible calls for the ben-

ediction after one is sated, the Rabbis have prescribed that the eating of a piece of bread the size of an olive or an egg, is enough to warrant the benediction after the meal. In view of the fact, that the main purpose of the benediction is to thank G-d, the Rabbis have made this very small amount of bread sufficient to warrant thankfulness to G-d. Let it be understood that G-d does not need our benediction. When we bless Him, we ourselves become exalted, buoyed up and inspired. In that way, the blessing or the benediction verily rests upon us.

Concerning the verse, "the earth is the L-rd's and the fullness thereof" (Psalm 24 verse 2) the Talmud declares, "whoever enjoys any worldly pleasure without uttering a benediction commits a theft against G-d".

Judaism declares that the table is the Altar. Therefore, every meal is to be sanctified by prayer. The spirited among our people have added on the Sabbath, the Zmiros,—"Songs of Joy". "The unique combination in these songs, of adoration of G-d, with genial appreciation of good cheer, is a product of the Jewish genius, which interweaves the secular with the sacred, and spreads over the ordinary facts of life the rainbow of the Divine. In this way, a Sabbath meal became literally a service of joy. To those who sing, and teach their little ones to sing these beautiful hymns and melodies, the Sabbath day is a foretaste of "That Day which is wholly a Sabbath and rest in life everlasting."
