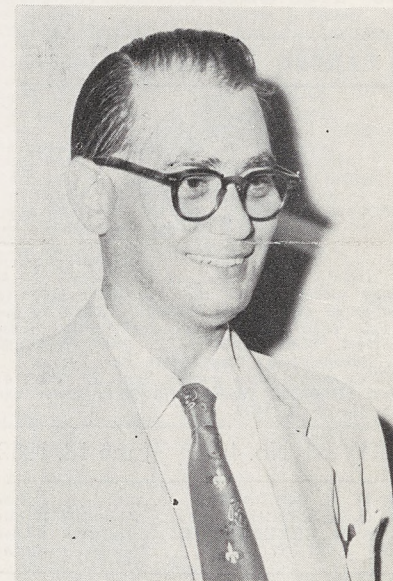

For Tuesday night's reception a fine program followed by a collation has been planned. Admission will be by invitation only.

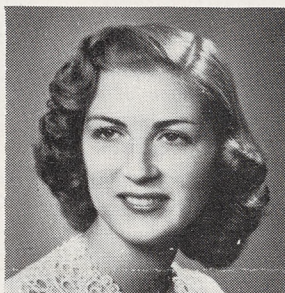

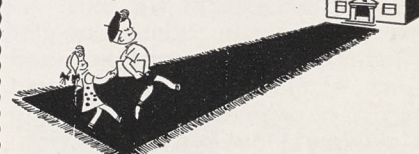
TALMUD TORAH NEWS

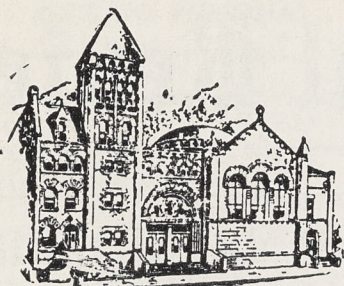

ISRAEL DIARY OF
MRS. HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN
JERUSALEM, JULY 11, 1951



The various deprivations seem terrible till we realize what is happening in Israel at present. Fifteen planes a day have been bringing practically 1,000 Iraqians into Israel, daily. These people are fleeing from persecution and intolerance. This month the immigration from Iraq will be ended. The entire Iraqi Jewish community will have been transferred to Israel. Then the "Air Lift" (as this form of bringing whole communities, into Israel, is called) from Iran, that is, Persia, will begin. When we stop to think how marvellous it is that a small country and a small people like Israel can and is willing to absorb so many hundreds of thousands of immigrants, we must be overwhelmed with admiration for the ingenuity, resourcefulness and idealism of the leaders. The present government believes that while there is a Jew, anywhere in the world, who wishes to enter Israel, the doors of Israel should remain open. Some of the parties which are running for election to the 2nd Knesset believe that immigration to Israel should be closed, for economic reasons. Most

505th OF THE BIBLICAL
COMMANDMENTS
"The Tribe Of Levi Is Not To Take
Any Part Of The Spoils"

The Tribe of Levi (Priests and Levites) were not to share in the spoils, in the conquest of Palestine, as we read in the Book of Deuteronomy, Chapter 18, verse 1: "The Priests, the Levites, even of the Tribe of Levi shall have no portion nor inheritance with Israel: They shall eat the offerings of the L-rd made by fire."

The Sifri, the Tanaatic Midrash, commenting upon this says, "No חֶסֶק 'portion' refers to 'spoil,' nor נַחֲלָה 'inheritance' refers to the 'land,' (even after the 14 years of conquest). In the verse following the commandment we have it, repeated again, "And they (Levites) shall have no inheritance; the L-rd is their

inheritance". These were the burnt, the meal, the thank, and the trespass offering. Certain specific parts of all of these belonged to the Priest. Wherever we have a negative commandment repeated in the Torah, it is to emphasize the matter, as in the case of a divorce, the commandment for a Priest not to marry her, is repeated again in regard to the High Priest. This was done to reinforce, to point out that the "Cohane", while he has other laws that are separate from the Levite, is bound by this commandment, namely, not to participate in the spoils of the enemy.

The purpose of this commandment is that the Priests and the Levites are servants of G-d and it is improper for them to use vessels of spoil that have come through war, by the sword, by the spear and the javelin. Furthermore, nothing may come into the House of G-d except by way of peace and righteousness.

This commandment prevailed in Temple times, refers only to the tribe of Levi. As for the other tribes it would be psychologically and realistically impossible.

Any of the Tribe of Levi (Levite or Priest) who took a portion of the spoils, violated this negative commandment.

of the immigrants who come in, now, go straight to the WORK VILLAGES, (which are situated near such public works as roads building and afforestation projects. Thus, they are housed in homes of their own, within 24 hours of their arrival, and become productive citizens, earning some kind of livelihood, within 3 or 4 days. This is a tremendous improvement upon the system which existed up till last year. Immigrants, upon their arrival, used to be put into transit camps, where they would hang around idly, for months, till they could get homes and employment. At the airport the immigrants now receive their medical examination, inoculation, registration, a little money, beds and food for 3 or 4 days. Before they go through this routine, they are taken into the dining hall and given tea and sandwiches to tide them over till their first meal in their new home. At the completion of the routine they mount a truck, which is accompanied by another truck carrying a bed for each immigrant, and they go to their destination.

Only those who are fit for physical

work are sent to WORK VILLAGES. (That is why every immigrant must get a medical check-up). The sick and the elderly are sent to Shaar HaAliyah, a very large camp near Haifa, where they receive more thorough medical examinations and treatment, or to other camps, till special arrangements can be made for them. Sooner or later the Jewish Agency gets them a home in one of its housing projects, usually in the cities, and finds work or opens a small shop for them, according to their capabilities. Skilled artisans are usually directed close to cities or industries and farmers are sent to agricultural settlements.

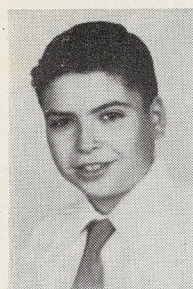

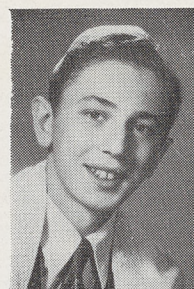
