MEN'S CLUB TO OPEN SEASON MONDAY NIGHT

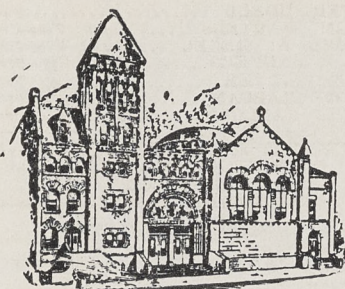

These two ventures were the brain children of the late Rabbi Berlin (Bar-Ilan) and are backed by the World Mizrahi.

Another department of the World Academy is the Mishpat Hatorah, where "Dayanim", religious judges, are being prepared for the State. These men are being trained in the Harry Fischel Institute. One of our Scholars, a Yemenite, has already been chosen as a Judge for Tel Aviv. The next appointment is also to be made from our institution.

Then we have the Chakika as the Codification of our Civil and Criminal Law. This codification is being sought by the Knesset, the Courts and the lawyers. Our first publication which is scheduled to appear within two months will be on the laws of sale.

Twenty-three years ago when I visited Rome, I was inspired with and jealous of what I saw there. A whole street of houses was set aside for "Propaganda Fidei", "For Propaganda of the Faith" as the sign read. At that time I hoped that some day we might have something similar for Judaism from Jerusalem, as the prophets Isaiah and Micah put it, "From Zion shall come forth the Law and the word of G-d

506TH OF THE 613 BIBLICAL COMMANDMENTS

To Give The Shoulder, The Jaw
And The Maw To The Priest.

I

All Israelites are commanded to give to the Priest from every animal that they slaughter the shoulder (right), the lower jaw and the stomach, as we read in Deuteronomy, Chapter 18, verse 3: "This shall be the Priest's due from the people, from them that offer a sacrifice, whether it be ox or sheep, and they shall give unto the Priest the shoulder and the two cheeks and the maw."

These gifts come from the animal slaughtered for ordinary consump-

tion as over against those brought as sacrifices. They were granted to the priests as a reward for the zeal of Phinehas, see Numbers, Chapter 25 verses 7 and 8. Phinehas took his life in his hands when he slew a prince of a tribe in Israel on behalf of the sanctification of G-d's name.

from Jerusalem." We now have a special Department in the World Academy known as אור לעולם "A Light to the World." We are printing pamphlets in Hebrew, English, Spanish and French, to be placed on all steamers (permission has already been given to us by the Cunard and American Export Lines) as well as in the Armies of the United States and of Israel. These pamphlets will present to Jew and Gentile the contributions of Judaism to Civilization.

My other major interest in Israel is in helping to save the orphans and refugee children for Judaism. I have had the great privilege through "Homes for Children in Israel" and with the very generous cooperation of our blessed Congregants, of being instrumental in bringing into being ten institutions for children: (1) the W.S.I.S. Children's Village near Rishon L'Zion, (2) Children's Village in Nativa, (3) Baby's Home in Pardesia, (Marbarah — Work Village), (4) Kindergarten — and a training school for kindergarten teachers — in Jaffa, (5) Sephardic Orphan Asylum in Jerusalem (1952), (6) W.S.I.S. Children's Day Nursery in (Katamon) Jerusalem (1952), a picture of which appears in this week's Review, (7) W.S.I.S. Children's Home in Bnei Brak (1951-1952), (8) Children's

Home in Petach Tikvah, (9) Children's Trade School in Petach Tikvah, (10) W.S.I.S. Baby Home in Rosh Hayin (Marbarah) 1952.

This work I believe speaks for itself and I trust it will receive your continued cooperation.
