Thursday, July 7 — Fast of Tammuz 17

This fast day commemorates the breach in the wall of the city of Jerusalem by the Romans, and the beginning of the persecutions which accompanied the downfall of the city and the destruction of the Temple.

The days until the Fast of the Ninth of Av are known as "Bein HaMezarim" (from Lamentations 1:3) and weddings and other public festivities are not held.

Wednesday, July 20 — Rosh Chodesh Av

"When Av begins, one should decrease his festivity." (Taanis 29) until after the 9th of Av. We do not eat meat from Rosh Chodesh Av until Tisha B'Av.

Thursday, July 28 Tisha B'Av

This is the anniversary of the destruction of the first and second Temples in Jerusalem (586 B.C.E. and 70 C.E.) This Fast, like that of Yom Kippur, commences at sunset of the preceding day (Wednesday) and lasts until the next night.

SUMMER FRIDAY SERVICES

During the summer months, Friday evening services will be held at 6:40 o'clock. During July and August daily morning services will commence at 6:45 and 8:15, and evening services at 8:00 o'clock.

Our readers are reminded that our air-conditioning system in the Daily Synagogue will be functioning during the hot weather months.

LONG RANGE PLANNING

Circumstances that are within our control, determine in large measure the kind of life we ultimately pursue. This truism applies to our religious make-up as well.

It has been brought to our attention, for example, that boys and girls who register in the junior high schools, high schools, and colleges, may choose "morning" or "afternoon" schedules. There are indeed many factors which every boy and girl has to consider in making his or her choice. But there is a very important problem facing those who choose the afternoon schedules, which usually comes to the fore when it is already rather difficult to solve. What does one do about the winter days, when the Shabbos begins at 4:10 — or even at 4:45?

Many youngsters who would not think of breaking the Shabbos laws — and spirit — have been unable to help themselves when their school marks and academic plans were at stake. Many Jewish boys and girls have been lost, Jewishly speaking, because we did not foresee this problem in time for them to fortify themselves accordingly.

We urge our readers to bring this problem to the attention of all parents of school children. Students who are registering soon for high school and college should apply for the morning sessions.

Any Rabbi will be happy to help along with a letter or a call to the school officials concerned.

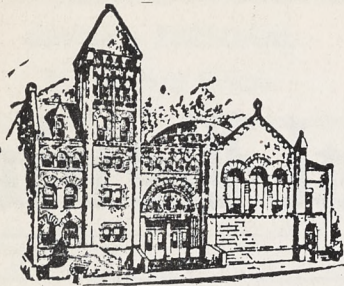

Psalms of Praise

"MANY ARE THE THOUGHTS IN A MAN'S HEART: BUT THE COUNSEL OF THE LORD, THAT SHALL STAND."

Many a tyrant from Haman to Hitler have conjured up thoughts as to how to destroy the Jewish people, but these thoughts were not in harmony with the counsel of the Lord. Therefore they could not

stand.

So we say every pious Jew in announcing a plan, will always add, "IM YIRTZE HASHEM." "if it pleases G-d," that his declaration may be in conformity with G-d's will.

"THE COUNSEL OF THE LORD STANDETH FOREVER: THE THOUGHTS OF HIS HEART TO ALL GENERATIONS"

The large outlines of G-d's plans for Israel, (though Israel is suffering a relapse, and a setback) yet His plans must all be verified. Just as some of His promises He made

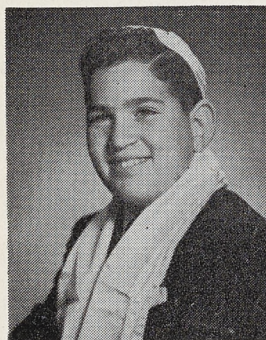

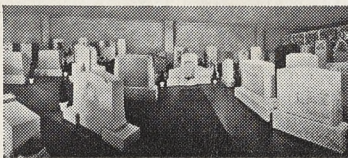
