This Sabbath we observe Parshas HaChodesh which celebrates the beginning of the month of Nisan, the month of Passover. This fact should certainly serve to impress our readers with the proximity of the Passover holiday and the necessity of making immediate preparations for it. One such preparation is the making of reservations for our Congregational Sedorim.

The sedorim will be held on the first two nights of the Passover holiday, Monday, March 26, and Tues-

day, March 27. They will take place at the Hotel Esplanade, West End Avenue, and 74th Street, within easy walking distance of the Synagogue. The charge of \$10 per person each Seder covers all expenses of the evening.

We urge you therefore, for your own comfort and enjoyment to make reservations for yourself and your family as soon as possible. The Synagogue Office will be glad to assist you.

The sale of Chometz must be completed by the morning of Monday, March 26. This coupon must therefore be in the hands of the Rabbis before that time.

# THE PRAYER BOOK

#### COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

שיר המעלות

This 130th Psalm is read during the Ten Days of Repentance (from Rosh Hashanah through the day of Atonement)

#### "OUT OF THE DEPTHS HAVE I CRIED UNTO THEE, O LORD."

"Depths" is here understood as a metaphor for pangs of conscience. From the abyss of soul suffering, out of the depths of guilt, we call on G-d and on Him only.

It may also be understood as a prophetic reference to the time when the **Maranos** in Spain had to hide themselves in cellars and in underground habitations in order to practice their religion.

"IF THOU O LORD, SHOULDST MARK INIQUITIES, O LORD, WHO SHALL STAND?"

"BUT THERE IS FORGIVENESS WITH THEE THAT THOU MAYEST BE FEARED."

Despair of Divine mercy would make one desperate. Were one to believe that there is no forgiveness, and since no one is free of sin, a person would not repent and improve, and since one would then be destined to perdition he would say "let us eat, and drink, for tomorrow we will die". License and the lack of restraint would become the order of the day. Therefore forgiveness has ever been a prop to a better life, making repentance a cornerstone of living Judaism. Being aware that it is possible to attain forgiveness, a person may try to exert himself to rehabilitate himself in the eyes of his Maker and lead a higher and nobler life.

Some of our Rabbis put the emphasis on "Thee". Sometimes forgiveness is given conditioned on future conduct, analageous to the modern "suspended sentence". If the culprit sins again, in the same direction, besides the penalty for the present misconduct, the amnesty for the past would be revoked. Thus "forgiveness is with Thee" as a pledge for later good conduct. This has become the nucleus of the famous hymn called "Oh-chez B'-yahd", which is chanted during the High Holy Days.
