

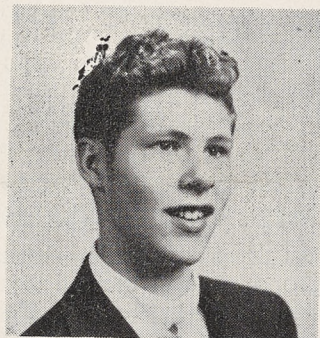

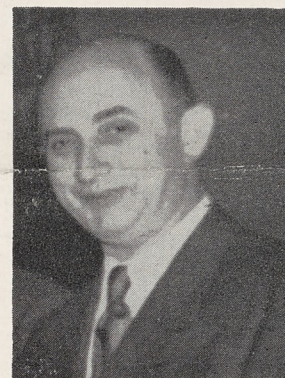

COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

שיר המעלות

"I WAIT FOR THE LORD, MY SOUL DOTH WAIT, AND IN HIS WORD DO I HOPE."

When we trust the Lord it is not because of our merit, but because we rely upon His given promise to forgive.

"MY SOUL WAITETH FOR THE LORD MORE THAN THE WATCHMEN WAIT FOR THE MORNING ETC."

For the morning cannot, by any means, be hastened to come earlier than it naturally does. But G-d's help and deliverance may arrive even before the expected time. Israel was originally destined to stay in the Egyptian bondage for four hundred years. But by Divine grace the redemption came a hundred and ninety years earlier than scheduled.

"O LET ISRAEL HOPE IN THE LORD FOR WITH THE LORD THERE IS LOVING KINDNESS, AND WITH HIM THERE IS PLENTIFUL DELIVERANCE."

In addition to the Divine promise, there is also the agency of Divine mercy which is a powerful guarantee of Israel's deliverance and perhaps more than promise and merit, since His mercies are so plentiful and of such unlimited supply that they could never be exhausted.

While requests based on merits or even promises are limited by the amount of our merit and by the scope and conditions governing the promise. The requests based upon Mercy are unlimited and coextensive with the Divine attribute to which they appeal.

"AND HE SHALL REDEEM ISRAEL FROM ALL HIS INIQUITIES".

Not only to we pray, in these days between Rosh Hashonah and the Day of Atonement, for our physical and material redemption, but we also express our eagerness and hope, for the attainment of our spiritual redemption, namely — He shall redeem us from our sins."

This is an Invocation calling the Congregation to a Prayer Service. Now, the Reader of the Service invites the Congregation to join in for the major part of the Service, — namely, the Sh'mah and the 18 Benedictions."

This is the answer to the call of the Reader, while he repeats, indicating his full accord, with the answer of the Congregation.

these verses, is recited by some silently. The Cantor or Reader prolongs the tune, for this invocation, so as to give the Congregation ample time to read it.

PASSOVER PREPARATIONS

What is Chametz?

Food or drinks made from wheat rye, barley, oats, corn and other grains are subject to the laws of chametz.

All green vegetables may be used except rice, millet, peas and beans.

Special care should be taken by all our co-religionists to verify the Passover kashruth of bakeries and other food stores. **Such signs as "Holiday", "Festival" or "Passover Cakes" do not mean kosher for Passover.** Unless these bakeries have authoritative endorsements, their products should not be used for Pesach. If in doubt, we urge you to contact our rabbis.

Dishes and Utensils

Since we are not permitted to have any trace of leaven in our food during Passover, special attention must be given to dishes and utensils. It is, of course, best to use dishes and utensils especially set aside for Passover use. However, under certain conditions some of these utensils used during the year may also be used on Passover, if they are "Kashered" or prepared for Passover use.

Silverware which has been used during the year may be Kashered by immersion in boiling water.

The Synagogue facilities for public kashering of vessels will be available on Sunday, March 25th, from 10 A.M. to 2 P.M.

Utensils that are used for frying and broiling require direct fire to the glowing point for kashering.

Dishes That Cannot Be Kashered

(a) All dishes of any porous material, such as chinaware, pottery, or earthenware.

(b) Utensils that may be damaged by hot water, e.g. where a utensil is glued together.

(c) Knives and utensils with handles of wood, plastic, etc.

(d) Vessels that cannot be thoroughly cleansed, such as a sieve.

The sale of Chometz must be completed by the morning of Monday, March 26. This coupon must therefore be in the hands of the Rabbis before that time.

I, (we) hereby authorize Rabbi Goldstein to dispose of all Chametz that may be in my possession, wherever it may be, at home, place of business or elsewhere, in accordance with the requirements of Jewish Law.

Preparation of the Oven

Every part of the oven or stove which may have been reached by food during the year, must be thoroughly cleaned and scraped. The oven and range must then be heated to a glow. During Passover, special tin sheets are placed over the top of the range to prevent contact with Passover utensils.

SALE OF CHOMETZ

The Biblical law regarding Passover forbids a Jew to own chametz over the Passover holiday. Any Chametz that is in the possession of a Jew is forbidden even **after** the holiday to the owner. In order to prevent hardship, a "bill of sale" of the chametz of the Jews of the congregation is made to a non-Jew.

Only those, however, who specifically authorize the Rabbis, by the appropriate instrument, to so dispose of their chametz may take advantage of this arrangement. A coupon for that purpose, to be found on this page of the Review, may be filled out and sent to the Synagogue. This must be in the hands of Rabbi Goldstein before Erev Pesach, the morning before the holiday.

In addition, those wishing to do so may see to the sale of their chametz in person at our Synagogue. Our sexton, Rabbi Pekier, will be available for that purpose every morning until 9:30 A.M., and in the evenings, from 4:30 to 6:30 P.M. and from 8 to 9:30 P.M.

MAKE YOUR SEDER RESERVATIONS BEFORE IT'S TOO LATE

Although the Passover holiday is almost with us, there is still some time left for those of our congregational family who wish to join us for the Congregational Seder, to make their reservations.

The Seder nights this year fall on Monday and Tuesday nights, March 26th and 27th. As in the past, we are holding the sederim at the Hotel Esplanade, West End Avenue and 74th Street, within easy walking distance from the Synagogue. The charge is the same as last year: \$10 per person per Seder, including all charges and gratuities.

The beauty and dignity of the Seder services is greatly enhanced by the participation of the congregation and their families. The interpolations and guidance of our Rabbis, Herbert S. Goldstein, and O. Asher Reichel, as well as the melodious singing of our Cantor Zalmon Yavneh, add up to an inspiring and spiritual evening.

THE STORY OF THE WORLD ACADEMY

THE WORLD ACADEMY in JERUSALEM was established under the inspired leadership of the Chief Rabbi of Israel, Dr. Isaac Halevy Herzog, and Rabbi Herbert S. Goldstein.

Side by side with the physical development of the State of Israel this project of great historic significance has undertaken the restoration and regeneration of the spiritual insights of the great sages of the Talmud who have given to the world some of the best and noblest in human thought.

The tradition to which the WORLD ACADEMY belongs is almost as old as Mt. Herzl upon which it stands. This tradition has given to civilization the concept of law ordained by G-d. There had been laws and lawmakers before, but the early Jewish Prophets were the first to accept, promulgate and establish the laws governing human conduct as the expression of the Divine will.

The Prophets of Israel were the first to call for justice in man's dealings with his fellow men. They were the first to put these "truths" into beautifully moving religious language of the Torah which had the impact to inspire the hearts and laws of mankind. Unfortunately since the destruction of the Temple 1900 years ago, many of these teachings have too often been forgotten. THIS CHALLENGE THE WORLD ACADEMY IS MEETING TODAY.

- 1) Their Institute For Research has prepared a digest of Jewish Law as a basis for new legislation for the Israeli Parliament.
- 2) The Judicial Institute prepares judges for decisions on all questions of personal status.
- 3) To give to mankind a complete history of Jewish civilization of the Encyclopedia Talmudit is being completed. Six volumes have already been published and the seventh is now on the press.
- 4) The Institute For The Revised Edition of The Talmud, has undertaken an improved edition. For the first time in history, the Talmud will be punctuated, and will include a digest of unpublished commentaries going back to the 11th century which have been gathered from the four corners of the earth. Some of the most important manuscripts have been made available by the Vatican, Bodleian, Oxford and Columbia University libraries.
- 5) In order that this research should not remain, locked within scholarly confines the "Light of the World" department is disseminating literature to peoples of all faiths all over the world in several languages, particularly among the youth in the armies and colleges of the world.

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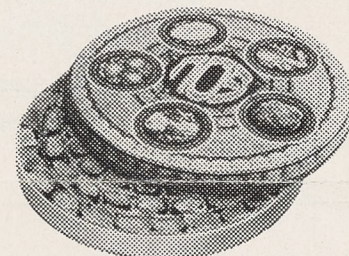
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
