COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

Blessings Before The 'Shma'

"WITH GREAT LOVE THOU HAST LOVED US".

This overwhelming conviction of G-d's real love, as shown by the selection of Israel, gave us daily renewed strength not only to live by, but if need be to die for the G-d of Israel, with "Shma Yisrael" on our lips.

"WITH GREAT AND OVERFLOWING PITY HAS THOU PITIED US".

Pity is related to love, as we read in Isaiah 63:9 "In His love and in His pity He redeemed them". G-d has shown His pity for us, in freeing us from the degrading philosophies and ways of life, of idolatry, as we read in Deuteronomy 7 verses 6 to 10 — "For thou art an holy people unto the Lord thy G-d: the Lord thy G-d hath chosen thee to be a special people unto himself, above all the people that are upon the face of the earth. The Lord did not set his love upon you, nor choose you, because ye were more in number than any people; for ye were the fewest of all people: But because the Lord loved you, and because he would keep the oath which he had sworn unto your fathers, hath the Lord brought you out with a mighty hand, and redeemed you out of the house of bondmen, from the hand of Pharaoh king of Egypt. Know therefore that the Lord thy G-d, he is G-d, the faithful G-d, who keepeth covenant and mercy with them that love Him and keep His commandments to a thousand generations; And repayeth them that hate Him to their face, to destroy them.'

Moses thus indicated to us that numbers do not count but love and loyalty do. We have never hankered after numbers. We have never accepted people into the fold of Israel by the mere repetition of a formula. We believe in quality not quantity, — not how many, but how many conscious and conscientious observers of the faith we have, is what interests us.

A rabbinic version has it, "The Lord did not set His love upon etc. because ye were aggrandizing yourselves more than any other people". Abraham said, "I am but dust and ashes" (Genesis, Chapter 18, verse 27). Moses and Aaron said (Exodus Chapter 16, verse 7) "And what at all are we?" King David said, "I am but a worm" (Psalm 22, verse 7). The heathens on the other hand, gave a different account of themselves. When G-d made Nimrod great, Nimrod said, "Let us build ourselves a city etc. and let us make ourselves a name etc." (Genesis, Chapter 11, verse 4). Pharaoh said, "Who is the Lord, that I should obey His voice to let Israel go?" (Exodus, Chapter 5, verse 2). Sennacharib said, "Who are they among all the gods etc. that the Lord should deliver Jerusalem out of my hand?" (See the second Book of Kings, Chapter 18, verse 35). When Nebuchadnezzar became great he said, "Into heaven will I ascend, above the stars of G-d will I exalt my throne etc. I will ascend above the heights of the clouds, I will be equal to a most High". (Isaiah, Chapter 14, verses 13 and 14) and Hiram, King of Tyre, said "A god am I on the seat of gods do I dwell. (Ezekiel, Chapter 18, verse 2). Chauvinism on the part of nations, or arrogance on the part of individuals, is abhorrent to the Lord.

Racial pride which expresses itself in an attitude of aloofness towards others has no justification in anyone. Were it not for the discipline of the Torah, under which we have been reared for thousands of years, we would be the same as any other people. Whatever we possess may be attained by any of the human race who are willing to submit to the discipline of the Torah.

Dr. Giora Josephthal, Treasurer of the Jewish Agency in Jerusalem and head of its Immigrant Absorption Department, speaking for our brethren in Israel said:
