COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

Blessings Before The 'Shma'

"AND MAKE US GO UPRIGHT TO OUR LAND".

Our going back should not be one of "hat in hand" policy of begging, but due to an internationally recognized right to go back to our ancestral home. (This comment was written before the United Nations came into existence).

"AND BROUGHT US NEAR".

By selecting us as the Chosen people.

"IN TRUTH".

Not because we were the greatest in number. We were the fewest in number. It was only after the other nations failed to accept the morality of the Commandments did Israel become the special object of G-d's love.

"AND PROCLAIM THY UNITY".

This is the ultimate of spiritual evolution — which, we will soon proclaim in the "shma" prayer.

"IN LOVE".

This prayer closes as it began on the high note of reciprocal love.

The Shma

"G-D, THE FAITHFUL KING".

The first letters of these three Hebrew words — spell "Amen" — which has been explained heretofore, with regard to the prayer "Blessed be the Lord forever — Amen and Amen". These three words are said when the "Shma" is recited privately. There are 245 words in the "Shma", and when we add the three words, we have 248, according to the number of the limbs of the body. When we pray with a Minyan, the Reader recites the three

"HEAR O ISRAEL THE LORD OUR G-D, THE LORD IS ONE".

Not three, nor any other number, but ONE. To make G-d a partner with others, denies His Omnipotence and pure Monotheism. This is Israel's confession of Faith — which he proclaims daily, and also on his death bed. Israel has lived and died for the purity of this Faith.

Both the Prophets Zephaniah and Zachariah have struck the same note, as we read "Yea, then, will I change unto the people, a pure language, that they shall call on the Name of the Lord, to serve Him, with one accord. (Zephariah, Chapter 3, verse 4) and "And the Lord will be King over all the earth: on that day the Lord shall be acknowledged

words אמת אלקיכם אמת to make up the number 248.

As a matter of fact, there are 613 Commandments in the Torah — 248 positive and 365 negative ones. — The 248 positive Commandments have an influence upon the 248 organs of the body, upon its ligaments. — There is no better hygiene for the body than moral purity, with G-d as the Physician ("For I am the Lord your healer", (Exodus 15:26), giving us the proper prescription.

as ONE, and his Name — ONE'' (Zachariah, Chapter 14, verse 9).

We close our eyes, when saying the "Shma", so as to exclude anything that may distract us, from complete concentration in repeating this formula of our Faith.

In this verse there are two letters written in larger type than the others, namely the "ayen" and the "daled". These two letters joined together, make the word "Ei-d" which means "witness". Israel is G-d's witness, as we read in the prophet Isaiah, Chapter 43, verses 10 and 13, "Ye are my witnesses saith the Lord . . . that I am G-d".

THE CRISIS IN ISRAEL DEMANDS OUR ATTENTION

Our Dinner for the United Jewish Appeal will take place on Wednesday evening, May 9. Have you made your reservation? You should be there to be counted as one who is ready to do his share so that Israel will be able to defend herself and survive.

In a letter received from Herbert A. Friedman, executive vice-president of the United Jewish Appeal, he writes:

"In Israel, the program I described to you in my last letter is going on: stockpiling of food and fuel, dispersal of storage facilities, additional electric generator stations, and the construction of trenches and air-raid shelters for defense. Mr. Ben-Gurion himself, as well as other government and army officials, spent a whole day recently at a border settlement strengthening the defenses. Newsreel cameras all over the world showed Ben-Gurion stringing barbed wire on stakes for a perimeter defense system. Haifa had a full-scale air-raid drill two weeks ago, in which all traffic stopped, people took shelter, the wardens came out, and the civil defense apparatus was tested.

"We can only watch and wait, but meanwhile our task should be more strikingly clear to us with

each passing day. These are the facts of life in Israel today. While the people of Israel are faced with problems of defense, they are unable to deal with mass immigration or other great humanitarian needs. We, the Jews of America, should take every possible step to raise as much money as we humanly can. Money can mean the reduction of suffering: the maintenance of new villages on the border; the quicker absorption of immigrants. Money can prevent break-down and can sustain courage."

Don't ignore this appeal. Every Jew who believes that Israel should be allowed to live, and exist, must help according to his means.

Both men and women are invited to our UJA dinner. Our guest of honor this year will be our friend and colleague, Mr. Joseph Settel, who has always been very active in our UJA drive in our Synagogue.

The dinner will take place Wednesday evening, May 9, at 6 P.M. at the Esplanade Hotel, West End Avenue and 74th Street. Please call Mr. Morris Jablow at the Synagogue and tell him that you will be present.


