COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

The 'Shma'

"ALL".

Not thy heart — thy soul, thy might. We are not merely to be inclined to G-d with our heart, soul and might, but to love Him with **ALL** our heart, and with **ALL** our soul, and with **ALL** our might.

"AND THESE WORDS, WHICH I COMMAND THEE TODAY SHALL BE IN THINE HEART".

This is a call for sincerity. Not only are these words to be on one's lips, but also in one's heart. Furthermore, one should ever be mindful of them, so as not to forget them.

"AND THOU SHALT TEACH THEM DILIGENTLY UNTO THY CHILDREN", ETC.

The acid test of one's sincerity is one's eagerness to transmit his convictions to his children. Furthermore, it is not enough to have the children taught while the parents are wasting their leisure hours instead of spending them in the study of the Torah.

"AND SHALL TALK OF THEM WHEN THOU SITTEST". To succeed

in the task of teaching our children properly we ourselves must make the Torah a part of our discussions at the table. Example is the best form of teaching.

"AND WHEN THOU LIEST DOWN AND WHEN THOU RISEST UP". This refers to the evening and morning services.

"AND THOU SHALT BIND THEM FOR A SIGN UPON THINE HAND, AND THEY SHALL BE AS FRONTLETS BETWEEN THINE EYES".

This refers to the "Tephilin".

A very significant interpretation has been placed upon the make up of the Tephilin. The Tephilin on the head is composed of 4 compartments, each one contains the section of the Torah wherein the command to put on the phylacteries, is given—(Exodus 13:1-10, 11:16; Deuteronomy 6:4-9, and 11:13-21). There are different approaches to Judaism. One may approach it from a legal point of view, another from a historic, another from an emotional, and another from a philosophical point of view. We may all have a different mental approach. But, when it

comes to action, or performance, there may be only one loyal action Therefore, the Tephilin on the hand — representing action — has all the four sections in one compartment. The various approaches to Judaism find their unity in a common action. As Americans of different mental attitudes towards our beloved America, we find our unity in the common denominator, of loyalty, in the practice of the laws as set down by our Constitution. So too as Jews, we may find our unity, in the common denominator of loyalty in practice to our religious Constitution, the Torah.

The Youth Torah Pilgrimage for teen agers (14 to 18) now in its fifth year, will convene in New York and Monsey, from June 22nd to 25th, under the joint sponsorship of the Rabbinical Council of America and the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America.

Hailed as a moving educational and religious revival by Rabbis and lay-leaders, the Pilgrimage in the past has attracted youths from dozens of communities in the United States and Canada.

The four-day pilgrimage will bring these youths in contact with Jewish institutions, places of learning, Jewish book publishers, the U.N., and other places of interest.

The Pilgrimages will be initiated in New York City and will be followed by a full program of Jewish living in Monsey Park Hotel, Monsey, New York.

Emphasis will be placed upon active participation in discussions of vital concern to Jews, acquisition of leadership skills, healthy recreational and social activities and an understanding of Judaism. The fee is \$36.
