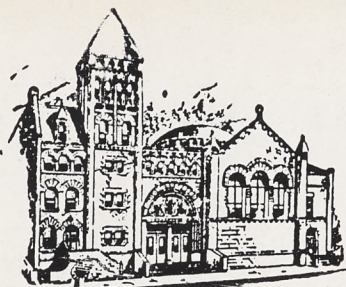
Selichos Saturday Night at 1 A.M.

The traditional beginning of the High Holyday season is the saying of the selichos or penitential prayers on Saturday after midnight, preceding Rosh HaShonah. Our Synagogue's services will be held at 1 A.M. this Sunday morning, September 2.

Both men and women are cordially invited and urged to attend the services which usually conclude in about an hour. These services are an especially fitting way to begin the season of introspection and soul-searching. At the services, special prayers are said in which we ask forgiveness of the Almighty and Merciful G-d for our sins of the past year. The Hebrew word for forgiveness is "selichos," hence the name of the special services.

THE PRAYER BOOK

COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

The 'Shma'

"AND YE SHALL TEACH THEM YOUR CHILDREN", ETC.

We note here the command for education. Our people were not to grow up in pious ignorance. Originally the matter was solely in the domain of the parents. However, the High Priest, Joshua, the son of Gemalah, saw to it that this verse should not be construed to refer merely as a paternal duty, but as a

communal duty as well. He instituted compulsory public school attendance in every village and hamlet. This compulsory school attendance was instituted by a High Priest in Israel TWO THOUSAND YEARS before it was adopted by the gentile world.

"THAT YOUR DAYS MAY BE MULTIPLIED, ETC. IN THE LAND WHICH THE LORD SWORE UNTO YOUR FATHERS", ETC.

The Rabbis say this promised longevity is not confined to those who dwell in the Holy Land but extends to those who frequent the synagogue for prayer and for the study of the

Torah even in the Lands of the Exile.

The synagogue is G-d's embassy. Thus, when the Jew is in the synagogue, he is, as it were, in the Holy Land, on G-d's own soil.

"UNTO YOUR FATHERS TO GIVE TO THEM," ETC.

"To give to them" the Rabbis say is a reference to the resurrection of the dead. It does not say "to give to you" but "to give to them" signifying that the Patriarchs themselves will some day arise and take possession of the Land of Promise. Thus, the belief in Resurrection is as ancient as the Torah.

These three paragraphs of the Shmah, form the center of our Morning and Evening Prayers.

The order here is based not upon the order in which it is found in the Torah, but upon its importance. The first paragraph comes from Deuteronomy, Chapter 6, verses 4-9, and deals with the acceptance of the rulership of G-d; the second comes

from Deuteronomy, Chapter 13, verses 13-21, deals with submission to the Divine law, and the third comes from Numbers, Chapter 16, verses 37-41, and deals with the Exodus of Egypt, and the means by which we may attain a holy life. Through the constant striving for holy living we constantly ascend to a higher and higher level in life. This makes for our IMITATIO DEI, as we read in Leviticus, Chapter 19, verse 1 "BE YE HOLY AS I AM HOLY" — This is what we mean by being created in the image of G-d, as we read in this Prayer, "That ye may remember and do all My commandments, and then ye shall be HOLY unto your G-d".

HOLYDAY NOTES

With the saying of the special Selichos prayers this Saturday night, we begin to usher in the High Holy-day season, known in Hebrew as Yomim Noraim, or Days of Awe. The Jewish celebration of the New Year is not a time for revelry, but rather an opportunity for serious soul-searching and self-examination. It is a time when we must make definite amends for any wrongs committed against G-d or man.

Shofar Blowing

According to Jewish law, it is incumbent upon everyone to hear the blasts from the shofar on each day. One reason suggests itself by virtue of the fact that the shofar has been for the Jewish people their traditional instrument of warning, danger, triumph and joy. It is sounded, therefore, at this time to awaken us to our duties to the Creator and our fellow-men.

Tashlich

One of the ways in which we demonstrate our desire to rid ourselves of our past wrongs and set out anew upon the proper path is the ceremony of Tashlich. On the first day of Rosh HaShonah (this year on Thursday) after Mincha, it is customary to go to the banks of a river or stream and recite certain psalms and prayers.

Shabbos Shuvah

The Sabbath which falls during the Ten Days of Penitence, between Rosh HaShonah and Yom Kippur, is known as Shabbos Shuvah, or the Sabbath of Repentance. Its name is derived from the verse in Hosea, read on that day, which begins: "Return (or "repent") O Israel unto G-d."

It is the custom for a Rabbi to give a special d'rasha, or halachic discourse. Rabbi Reichel will deliver this traditional discourse in the afternoon.

Fast of Gedaliah

This minor fast which commemorates a sad chapter in our Jewish History is observed the day after Rosh HaShonah. When the Fast

falls on a Saturday, then it is postponed to the next day, namely on Sunday, as is the case this year.

ERUV TAVSHILIN

The Law does not permit the cooking or baking of food on one day of Yom Tov for the next day of Yom Tov or Shabbos. Inasmuch as this year the days of Rosh Hashonah fall on Thursday and Friday (followed by Shabbos) the ceremony of Eruv Tavshillin must be performed on Erev Rosh Hashonah. The symbolic Eruv Tavshillin meal prepared on Wednesday enables the housewife to complete the cooking of this meal on Friday.

A Matzah or Challa and a piece of meat or fish are placed on a plate. The master of the house lifts the plate and recites the blessing:

Boruch ataw adon-ai elo-henu meleih haolam asher kidsha-nu b'mitz-vo-sav, v'tzi-va-nu al mitzvas e-ruv. Then say: "By virtue of this Eruv, be it permitted to us to bake, cook, keep the food warm, light the candles, and do all that is necessary on the Festival for the Sabbath."

On Saturday afternoon the food is to be eaten.

MEALS IN OUR SUCCAH

Reservations for the evening meals during Chol Hamoed and for Shemini Atzeres should be made at once by phoning our office TR 7-8281.

Breakfast may be had in the Succah on Chol Hamoed, after any one of our three morning services.

The Lulav and Esrog may be obtained through our Sexton, Rabbi Pekier. He may be reached either at the Synagogue office or at his home, SC 4-5163.

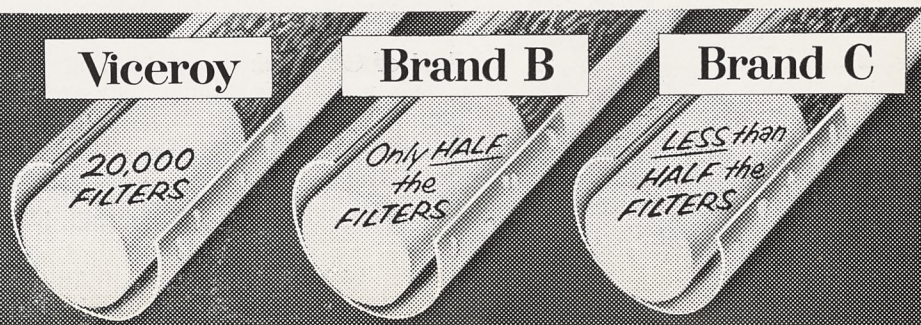
