THE PRAYER BOOK

COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

'Shemoneh Esreh'

Immediately after "Blessed art Thou, Oh, Lord" גאל ישראל גאל ישראל "who hath redeemed Israel (from Egyptian bondage)", we must begin the 18 (or 19) Benedictions as the Talmud declares "it is necessary to join the declaration concerning redemption with תפלה PRAYER (the 18 benedictions). I always feel as I join these prayers together morning and evening, that our Redemption can only come about through Prayer, — reliance upon G-d. Even Mr. Ben Gurion said concerning the recent War of Independence "He who has not witnessed miracles in the defeat of the seven Arab nations (surrounding Israel) was not a realist." With practically no weapons, we beat the Arab nations. Certainly the words of the Prophet Zechariah came true, - "It is not (merely) by might, and not (merely) by strength but by My spirit sayeth the Lord of Hosts." As Father Jacob put it (see Genesis Chapter 48, Verse 22) "Which I have taken from the hand of the Amorite' "With my sword and my Arrow" which the Talmud

translates as "with my prayer and my supplication." The Talmud (in Baba Basra 123a) asks, "Did he (Jacob) take his sword and his arrow? Has it not been said (Psalm 44, Verse 7) "For I will not trust in my arrow, and my sword shall not save me." (verse 8) "But THOU hast saved us from our Enemies." Scripture employs a circumlocution. For Prayer and Petition, it employs the words sword and arrow. Esau depends upon the Sword as we read "Upon thy sword shall thou live." It is written "The Voice is the voice of Jacob." Supplication serves Jacob as an offset to the blessing concerning the arrow which was given to Ismael (Genesis 21:20) "and he became an archer," and to the blessing to Esau, "by thy sword shalt thou live." (Genesis 27:40) Israel's prayer and supplication are his means, by which he receives G-d's protection. "The hands, are the hands of Esau but the voice — it is the voice of Jacob." When the voice of Jacob is supreme, then the hands of Esau are weak.

"O L-RD OPEN THOU MY LIPS AND MY MOUTH DECLARE THY PRAISE."

At a recent Convention, a speaker rose in the midst of a discussion and said: "We talk too much of ourselves, our might, our deeds. Let us heed the opening words of the 18 Benedictions, "O, L-rd open Thou my lips, and may my mouth declare **Thy** praise" (and not **ours**).
