In making his announcement, the President emphasized once again that the Building Fund Committee — under the co-chairmanship of Director Benjamin Glazer and Director Saul Linzer, with Director Jess Gross serving as treasurer — that **contributions to the Campaign may be made in one to four payments in a period of two years.** It is hoped that this policy will encourage all of our friends, without any exception, to participate as fully as they can in this important community project.

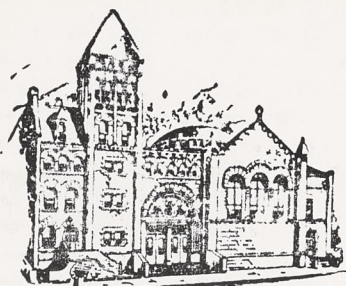
ALBUM COMMITTEE CALLS FOR EFFORT NOW

Awveenu Mahlkaynu Prayers

"TURN US NOT BACK EMPTY HANDED"

If we ask for a gift from a rich man, we expect a good gift, so too with G-d, we ask that our prayers be answered abundantly. Since we have the power to pray, we ask that we be not turned away empty-handed.

"THIS HOUR"

We cannot always be worthy. We ask that this be a propitious hour.

"DO THIS FOR THE SAKE OF THEM THAT WERE SLAIN AND FOR THY HOLY NAME"

Down until the last "AVINU-MALKAYNU" we invoke G-d's help not for our merits, but because of His Holy Name, which is connected with Israel, and because of our martyrs, who gave their lives for the sanctification and the unity of G-d's name.

"SLAIN"

Referring to those who were stoned.

"SLAUGHTERED"

By the sword and for those who received all kinds of suffering for Thy name.

"AVENGE"

Otherwise Jewish people become "heffker" or "ownerless," and people may do as they please with us, as with public property.

"DO IT FOR THY SAKE"

As we say in the Hallel, Psalm 115, "Not for us, O Lord, not for us, but for Thy name." We are intricately and intimately connected with G-d. If we suffer, it is G-d's name that is tarnished.

MRS. LIVINGSTON TO BE HOSTESS

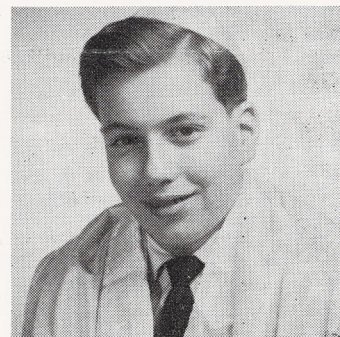

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OUR UNITED JEWISH APPEAL DINNER TO TAKE PLACE TUESDAY, MAY 7

Our United Jewish Appeal Dinner will take place on Tuesday, May 7, at the Esplanade Hotel, West End Avenue and 74th Street. Will you be there? Can we count on you?

The following letter from Rabbi Herbert Friedman, executive vice-president of the UJA should indicate some of the importance of your participation this coming Tuesday:

"... You will recall we went abroad to prepare, among other things, for the arrival of the first large refugee ship from Egypt. Since early January, the total number of Jews expelled from Egypt has risen to 14,000.

"The pressing problem seems to be a technical one of transportation, with simply not enough railroad cars available. The Jewish Agency officials are talking about ships and even planes, in order not to lose time ... I had a cable yesterday from Israel which stated very simply that there are currently 4,000 refugees in Marseilles, Genoa and Athens awaiting transportation to Israel; that it is anticipated that the immigration for March, April and May will total 31,000; and that the entire problem is being officially presented to Mr. Ben Gurion. We expect this year over 100,000 new immigrants.

"This is a 'human' flood. There is nowhere near the amount of money available from foreseeable sources to building the houses, prepare

the settlements, provide the services necessary for the reception and absorption of these people ... You must realize what this means to the people of Israel. During the very same period of the mounting refugee flood, Israel was living through the tension of uncertainty on the international diplomatic front ...

"On one issue, they were not uncertain. Thousands of refugees poured into his country, and the Israeli greeted them at the port, the airfield, the trucks on the roads carrying them to outlying settlements. The man on the street did not utter a word of protest or caution. He did not say, 'enough.' On the contrary, he moved over, made room for the newcomers, and drew pride and strength from the fact that Israel was fulfilling her holy mission of providing a home for the wanderers."

No one at our dinner this Tuesday — which will honor Director Jacob Goodman — will be forced to pledge more than he can afford to give. Please remember, however, that we are counting on your attendance. Kindly telephone or write to me NOW so that we can make the proper reservation for you.
