THE PRAYER BOOK

COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

V'hoo Rachum

G-d's Truth

G-d's "truth" we enjoy when we deserve it. Then why the need to pray for it? The answer is that "Emes" "Truth" is greatest when it is carried out together with loving-kindness. The saying goes, that which was a "Chesed" "lovingkindness" to Abraham, becomes "Emes" "a truth to Jacob". Here, and very often in Scriptures, we have the expression, "Chesed V'Emes", "love and truth" to indicate that when we truthfully deserve a reward, we pray it should be given to us with "chesed" with "lovingkindness."

So too, "Chesed", "lovingkindness", implies a promise by G-d,

which He always fulfills, as we say daily in our prayers "Thou givest "Emes" Truth to Jacob, which was a "Chesed" (a promise of) lovingkindness, to Abraham" — (See last verse of the Book of Micah) — G-d never fails to make good, any promise for good He has made, He may fail to carry out any promise to punish, if the person, or the people involved repent, as we read in the Book of Jonah, Chapter 3 verse 10 "And G-d saw their works, that they had turned from their evil way; and G-d bethought Himself of the evil, which He had spoken that He would do unto them, and He did it not.'

"TO GIVE THANKS TO THY HOLY NAME, AND TO TRIUMPH IN THY PRAISE"

This is the purpose of the Ingathering of the Exiles, to proclaim to the world G-d in History, His revelation, and His miraculous saving of His people, the fewest of the peoples in the world. Psalm 130 verse 3.

"IF THOU SHOULDST MARK INIQUITIES, O LORD WHO COULD STAND"

If Thou shouldst set down every deviation in thought, word, and deed, from Thy holy law; and if Thou shouldst call us into judgment for all our infidelities, both of heart and life: "O Lord, who could stand? Who could stand such a trial, and who should stand acquitted in the judgment? This is a most solemn saying; and, if we had not the doctrine that is in the next verse, — who could be saved?" (From Clarke's Commentary on the Psalms).

If that would be the case, there is no hope for any of us. We would say, I am lost anyway. I might as well indulge myself in every way, and leave no room for the higher things in life.

"BUT THERE IS FORGIVENESS WITH THEE THAT THOU MAYEST BE FEARED."

Despair of Divine mercy would make one desperate. Were one to believe that there is no forgiveness, and since no one is free of sin. a person would not repent and improve, and since one would then be destined to perdition, he would say "let us eat, and drink, for tomorrow we will die". License and the lack of restraint would become the order of the day. Therefore forgiveness has ever been a prop to a better life, making repentance a cornerstone of living Judaism. Being aware that it is possible to attain forgiveness, a person may try to exert himself to rehabilitate himself

in the eyes of his Maker and lead a higher and nobler life.

Some of our Rabbis put the emphasis on "Thee." Sometimes forgiveness is given conditioned on future conduct, analagous to the modern "suspended sentence". If the culprit sins again, in the same direction, besides the penalty for the present misconduct, the amnesty for the past would be revoked. Thus "forgiveness is with Thee", as a pledge for later good conduct. This has become the nucleus of the famous hymn called "Oh-chez B'-yad", which is chanted during the High Holy Days.

Our Talmud Torah Office is now in the process of accepting registration forms from parents of pupils who plan to enter our Talmud Torah during the next school year.

Although the school term does not begin until September, it is important that as many children as possible register in the Talmud Torah before they leave for their summer vacations. Only by advance information as to the number of children who plan to attend classes, can proper preparations be made for them. The hiring of proper teaching personnel, the acquisition of textbooks and other teaching materials, and the planning of appropriate curricula, all take a considerable amount of time. Only if this work can be begun during the summer months, can the children attending the Talmud Torah be assured an adequate program.

We hope, therefore, that as many children as possible will register during May and June for the coming year, even though they might still be accepted by later registration in September.

In addition to the regular classroom work in our Hebrew School, we are also proud of our extra-curricular program for the children. This past year, this has included such activities as arts and crafts, choral group, and outings. These

KASHRUTH CAUTION

The Rabbinic administration of the ① has called upon rabbis to inform their communities about increased utilization of animal fats even by firms stating that they are using vegetable products. A ruling which is not generally known, permits firms to employ the term vegetable fat, if it has a small percentage of animal fat.

The animal fat appears in various disguises such as softeners in bread and chewing gum. Products with the following ingredients: shortening, vegetable shortening, emulsifier, softener, mono and diglycerides, stabilizer, stereate, gelatin, K gelatin, rennet, rennin, glycerin, should not be used without responsible rabbinic supervision.
