We note below — for the convenience of our readers — some of the events of the Jewish calendar for the summer.

Saturday and Sunday, June 29 and 30 — Rosh Chodesh Tamuz Tuesday, July 16 — Fast to Tammuz 17

The fast day commemorates the breaching of the walls of the city of Jerusalem, which led to the destruction of the second Temple by the Romans. The Talmud (Taanis 26b) ascribes other unfortunate

events to the same day.

The days until the Fast of the Ninth of Ab are known as "bein ha-mezarim" (see Lamentations 1:3) and weddings and other public festivities are not held.

Monday, July 29 — Rosh Chodesh Av

It is customary not to eat meat from Rosh Chodesh Av until Tisha B'Av.

Tuesday, August 6 — Fast of Tisha B'Av

This is the sad anniversary of the destruction of the first Temple by (Continued on Page 2)

RECEPTION FOR MAN OF YEAR ON TUESDAY, JUNE 18




M. Jack Berlin

V'hoo Rachum

"SAVE WE BESEECH THEE, O LORD"

We pray that we may be saved from trouble.

"WE BESEECH THEE, O LORD, SEND PROSPERITY"

Even if we are saved from trouble, we pray to G-d that He may prosper us — and that we may succeed in our undertakings.

"FOR THEE, O LORD, WE WAIT"

We are waiting for a long time, and we are still looking to Him for the redemption —

"FOR THEE, O LORD, WE HOPE"

We hope that the redemption will come quickly.

"FOR THEE, O LORD, WE TRUST"

We trust that the time of the redemption will not only come, but come soon, at a definite time.

"O THOU, WHO OPENEST THY HAND TO REPENTANCE, TO RECEIVE TRANSGRESSORS AND SINNERS"

We have been asking so much for forgiveness, why now a reference to repentance? We declare that G-d's goodness, is so far reaching, that He Opens His hand to receive even those who are in deep sin, to repent.

"LET US FALL I PRAY THEE INTO THE HAND OF THE LORD, FOR HIS MERCIES ARE MANY; BUT LET ME NOT FALL INTO THE HAND OF MAN"

David was offered a choice of three punishments, 1) seven years of famine, 2) to flee for 3 months before his foes, who shall pursue him or 3) three days of pestilence in the land. David answered he would rather accept the bitter from G-d, rather than the sweetness of man, and accordingly he chose the pestilence, even though as king, he might receive special privileges. Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon in 586 B.C.E., and of the second Temple by the Roman Titus in 70 C.E.

This fast day, like that of the Day of Atonement, begins at sunset of the preceding day (Monday) and lasts until nightfall.

Tuesday and Wednesday, August 27 and 28 — Rosh Chodesh Elul

This is the month prior to the Holyday season. We begin to read the special penitential psalm, "L'Dovid ori" (Ps. 27).

A MESSAGE FROM THE RABBINICAL COUNCIL OF AMERICA

Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur are a period of spiritual regeneration, which should be spent in prayer and penitence. We are deeply disturbed by the fact that many people have established the custom of leaving their homes and Synagogues to spend these sacred days in hotel and resort areas. Thus these Yomin Noraim (Days of Awe) have been transformed into vacation periods. This trend threatens to undermine the role and the security of the Synagogue in Jewish life.

The period of the High Holidays is an unsurpassed opportunity to impress the young generation and to draw them closer to Judaism. Our children who are denied the religious experience of these Days of Awe are missing that vital inspiration which in our own youth permanently attached us and our loyalties to our houses of worship.

Our sages teach us, "He who established a regular place for his prayers, G-d of Abraham will come to his aid and heed his prayer."


