## THE ASHRAY PSALM

(Continued)

"THE LORD UPHOLDETH ALL THAT FALL, AND RAISETH UP THOSE THAT ARE BOWED DOWN."

Humility weighs heavily upon the scale of merit. Many a  $\sin$  is erased by a tear falling from a contrite soul.

"THE LORD UPHOLDETH ALL THAT FALL AND RAISETH UP ALL THOSE THAT ARE BOWED DOWN."

Man's fall as a rule is of his own making, but he is raised by the power of G-d, as we read in Hallel "He raiseth up the lowly out of the dust, and lifteth up the needy from the dunghill" (Psalm 113 verse 7). This is an evidence of the neorness of G-d. He is a Personal G-d, a G-d of Providence.

"THE LORD IS RIGHTEOUS IN ALL HIS WAYS AND LOVING IN ALL HIS WORKS."

## RABBI GOLDSTEIN'S PRAYER EVOKES RESPONSE FROM PRESIDENT EISENHOWER

When President Eisenhower suffered a mild stroke recently, our beloved Rabbi, Herbert S. Goldstein, composed the following prayer in the President's behalf, and offered it at our Sabbath Services; "Heavenly Father, we pray for the health and well-being of our President, Dwight David Eisenhower, standard bearer of the United States of America. In his well-being, we find hope for world peace. In his thinking, war is unthinkable. We invoke thine aid in behalf of world amity that he be spared to our country and to mankind as well, to continue unabated his sincere efforts for world peace. And let us all say, Amen.

One of the congregants, Mr. Emanuel Goldman, a friend of the President, present at the Sabbath Service, sent a copy of the prayer to the President and it evoked the following reply:

story of Judith who in order to save her city from the siege by the Syrian general Holofornes, enticed him to partake of her cheese pancakes and wine. She thus got him drunk and drowsy and then beheaded him, throwing his army into confusion and relieving the besieged city. This by the way is the origin of the Chanukah "latkes".

The elders too showed remarkable bravery as exemplified in the story of Mattathias and Eliezer the elder.

The lesson of Chanukah, therefore, teaches us that all religious people, regardless of sex or age, should unite in their efforts for Judaism. If they do this they can be assured that G-d's wonders will be forthcoming as demonstrated in the times of the Maccabees or as we say in Al Hanisim prayer, "in those days and at the present time."

## FORMER PRESIDENT HARRY S. TRUMAN WILL BE THE GUEST OF HONOR AT THE "WORLD ACADEMY" DINNER, JANUARY 12, 1958

The "World Academy was organized 5 years ago as an outgrowth of the "United Research Institutions for Higher Jewish Studies in Jerusalem" now widely scattered in the Holy City. These institutions will be brought together on one campus, where eight new buildings will be erected at the cost of two million dollars.

An historic plot of land has been purchased in the beautiful section of Bayit V'Gan, consisting of more than four acres, facing the Tomb of Doctor Theodor Herzl, the founder of modern Zionism.

When completed, the Academy will house the following institutions:

 The Institute for the study of Torah legislation in Israel as it may be applied to modern times.

 Seminars for the study of comparative law to which some of the greatest judicial minds in the world will be invited to participate.

 The Institute for the Revised Edition of the Talmud Bavle and Talmud Jerushalmi.

4. The Institute of the Talmudic Law Encyclopedia.

5. The Seminary for the study of the Bible as a challenge to higher criticism.

 World Academy Press.

 "Or L'Olam", an intellectual missionary movement for Jewish youth that will interest all young Jewish students.

Moshe Shapiro, Minister of Religion and Welfare in Israel, is the Chairman of the Executive Committee: Dr. Leo Jung, Rabbi of the Jewish Center of New York City, is the Chairman of the Publication Committee. Chief Rabbi Israel Brodie of Great Britain, Chief Rabbi Jacob Caplan and Baroness G. de Rothschild of Paris are the European members of the Board of Trustees.

An American committee, consisting of prominent rabbis, jurists, and lay leaders of the leading Jewish communities in America, has been formed.

The Jewish nation has never been strong numerically, politically, military, or even economically. Its strength through the ages is to be found in its spiritual fibre rather than in its materialistic fabric.

The great problem since the creation of the State of Israel, has been, will the new State take its proper place in the world of today? Will it again become outstanding as a spiritual center for all mankind?

This challenge of history is now being met by the "World Academy for Higher Jewish Studies in Jerusalem."

At the Dinner on January 12 in the Grand Ballroom of the Waldorf-Astoria, we are fortunate in having as our guest of honor the former President of the United States, Harry S. Truman who first recognized Israel as a state. We want to thank him for what he did for Israel and for what he stands for today.


