ASARAH B'TEVES NEXT THURSDAY

The minor fast day of Asarah B'-Teves, the tenth day of Teves will be observed next Thursday, January 2, 1958.

This fast commemorates the beginning of the fatal siege of Jerusalem by the armies of Nebuchadnezer, king of Babylon, which culminated in the destruction of the first Temple in 586 B.C.E.

Being a minor fast, it is observed by fasting from sunrise to sunset of the same day. Selichos prayers are said in the morning and a special portion of the Torah is read both at the Morning and at the Mincha Service

Recently this day has received additional significance by being proclaimed by the Chief Rabbinate of Israel, as the yahrzeit of all Jews murdered by the Nazis, whose day of death has remained unknown to

Psalm 20 (Continued)

"OUT OF ZION."

not the sanctuary, but the nation — the people in general.

"AND ACCEPT THY SACRIFICE"

referring to the whole burnt offering, offered entirely to G-d. Neither the priest or the one bringing the offering — derives any benefit therefrom. This is an evidence of our sincerity.

"THY HEART'S DESIRES"

to be answered by G-d.

"OUR PLANS"

refers to what we can do to carry out our planned desires.

"WE WILL SHOUT"

or sing. We give thanks, and pray for the future.

"IN THY SALVATION"

that our own personal private prayers will be fulfilled. Our Rabbis put it this way, "If we pray for others, our prayers for ourselves are answered first."

"NOW I KNOW"

more correctly, "I have known". Why the past tense? The answer is, I have known Him, but now I know Him better," or before "I believed in Him, now I KNOW HIM. Just as G-d helps us now, He will do so in the future."

"FROM HIS HOLY HEAVEN"

Although G-d is in Holiness in Heaven, He will come down to us, because we are joined to Him in Holiness, through the Torah.

WITH THE MIGHTY SAVING"

When G-d helps Israel, it is always a revelation of His Great Power, — the crossing of the Red Sea, the Revelation of the Law, the conquest of the Holy Land, particularly at Jericho, and in our own day in 1948, and at the Sinai Peninsula and Gaza — with little or no loss of life, — thank G-d. Would only that we be willing to understand this and all its implications.

"TRUST IN CHARIOTS . . . AND IN HORSES"

The nations have trusted fundamentally in the material bases, we have trusted fundamentally in G-d. There are many that believe in G-d, but not in His Way of Life.

"BUT WE WILL MAKE MENTION IN THE NAME OF THE LORD, OUR G-D"

Whether we find ourselves needing 'in "the Lord," the symbol of Mercy, or "Elohim" G-d, meaning strict justice, we call upon Him at all times. We go further as the Psalmist put it (Psalm 1010:1) "Whether it be loving-kindness or strict justice (which Thou showest), I will sing".

"THEY ARE BORED DOWN AND ARE FALLEN"

They do not exist for ever. They fall, and as history has shown us, they pass out from the world scene.

"WE ARE RISEN AND STAND UPRIGHT"

We remain standing even although we are constantly persecuted.

"SAVE LORD"

Although we are near to Thee, and even if we are not near, we beseech G-d, that we be answered.

"CN THE DAY WHEN WE CALL"

The servant who is not on personal terms, must go through official channels before he can reach the king — this takes quite some time. We pray also, that although we are not close to Him, as we should be, He may answer us NOW — when we call upon Him.

ISRAELI DIARY by Mrs. Herbert S. Goldstein June 23, 1957

(Continued)

In Tel Aviv, we had a very pleasant visit with the Goren's, Naomi's brother-in-law and sister-in-law. Rabbi Goren, who, as you know, is the Chief of Chaplains in the Israeli Army, has a real military personality, seemingly stern and forbidding, but basically very warm and friendly.

You may have read some of the stories in the American papers and periodicals about his exploits during the Sinai Peninsula Campaign. One was particularly interesting. He had gone to search for some water and found himself face to face with a group of Egyptian soldiers. He spoke to them in Arabic, in which he is very fluent, giving them the impression that he was an Arab. Since his uniform led them to believe that he was an officer, they obeyed the orders he gave them, to follow him, till he led them into the Israel camp, where they were made prisoners. Talk about bravery!

His wife told us of the interesting experience she had recently when she spent Passover on a warship with her husband in the Gulf of Aquaba, where Rabbi Goren conducted the Seder service for the sailors on the ship.

The Gorens have a little girl, aged 2½, whom they call Drorah. (Liberty). The names parents give their children here are most interesting.

TR 4-6843 A twin was born in our neighborhood the other day, and one was named Shalom and the other Bracha— Shalom Uvracha— meaning peace and blessing, is a very customary salutation here. I heard one child called "Medina" (State) (affectionately called "Medina'le"). The names of many children here express concepts which mean much in the daily existence of their parents.

Last Wednesday afternoon we accepted an invitation of our cousin, Professor Joseph Klausner, to attend the presentation of an annual prize which he gives in memory of his wife, at the Hebrew University. As you know, the original Hebrew University was built in 1925 on Mount Scopus. Mount Scopus is now in the hands of the Arabs and therefore unable to be used by Israel. Since the Arabs took over Mt. Scopus, the University activities have been carried on in scattered buildings of all kinds all over Jerusalem. The building in which Naomi took her courses is a monastery by the name of Terra Sancta. Part of it is still occupied by monks.
