ACTUAL WORK FOR NEW BUILDING STARTED!

OLD STRUCTURE NEXT TO MAIN BUILDING BEING TORN

DOWN — WORK BEGAN JANUARY 2nd.

Mr. Al Colin, Chairman of the Building Committee, announces that his committee composed of Maurice Greenstein, Vice-Chairman, Harry Altman, A. M. Druckman and Jacob H. Silverstein has come to terms with the builder and that actual work in preparation for tearing down the old structure next to our main building has begun on Thursday, January 2nd. On its site a brand new fireproof building will be erected. In addition a new entrance

to the main building will be built, and the Social Hall will be altered and renovated into a Grand Ball Room.

Upon completion of this project, it will house a Kindergarten, Talmud Torah, Junior Congregation, Arts and Crafts room, Women's League and Men's Club rooms, as well as facilities for Roofgarden, Succah, Modernized Kitchen, Grand Ballroom, and Lounge.

THE PRAYER BOOK

COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

THE וכא לציון PRAYER"

The first part of the prayer leads up to the sanctification prayer of the Supreme Holiness of G-d — called Kidusha D'sidrah.

"AND A REDEEMER SHALL COME TO ZION" (See Isaiah Chapter 59

verses 20 and 21)

We read in Psalm 87:2 "those who love the Lord, the gates of Zion," the play is on the word Zion which means "distinguished", and should be understood as "the gates" 'distinguished' by the discussion of the Law.

"AND TO THEM WHO TURN FROM TRANSGRESSION"

Those who repent.

"MY WORDS SHALL NOT DEPART"

The Torah will come back to her original owner. The door must be left open although many have left us.

"THIS IS MY COVENANT"

that the Torah will not be entirely forgotten. Even in Soviet Russia in spite of all the agitation against religious learning, still it flickers and will become more luminous as life goes on.

"BUT THOU ART HOLY"

Although G-d is Holy, He dwells among the praises of Israel, because they are holy, not full of anthromorphisms. We emphasize beauty of the Holiness and not the holiness of beauty.

"AND ONE CRIED UNTO ANOTHER"

The angels too call among themselves, 'holy, holy, holy, is G-d.'

"HOLY, HOLY, HOLY"

is expressed in the superlative, by repeating the noun three times, as we also say of G-d, "the King, the King of Kings". Now we explain the repetition of Holy three times.

"HOLY IN THE HIGHEST HEAVENS"

the seat of His Holiness.

"HOLY UPON THE EARTH"

supporting all nature. He creates light, etc.

"HOLY FOREVER"

His holiness will be for the future forever.

"THEN A RUACH," "A SPIRIT," LIFTED ME UP

The spirit of Prophecy lifted me up, — exalted me.

"THE VOICE OF A GREAT RUSHING"

The strong voice of the Angels.

"FROM HIS PLACE"

from wherever G-d is, in the world. He is everywhere. Two people were discussing G-d. One said G-d is NO WHERE; the other replied, you did not set the letters correctly. It should read, G-d is NOW HERE.

"THE LORD SHALL REIGN FOR ALL TIME"

referring to the 3rd Holiness, mentioned above. Now we pray that G-d should guard us according to our

"INWARD THOUGHT"

that our good "inward thoughts" may be put into practice. Man has many good thoughts, but we pray that they should be put into action.


"AND DIRECT THEIR HEART"

ISRAELI DIARY

Several years ago the Hebrew University bought a tremendous tract of land in the neighborhood of Beth Hakerem, a nearby suburb of Jerusalem. On these grounds a number of buildings have been erected, some on the top of hills and some in the valleys. We went through some of these buildings while we were on the University grounds. Their structure and furnishings are absolutely the last word in every respect. No modern device has been omitted which could give these buildings a maximum of efficiency and beauty. As for the functions of these different structures they vary from the science buildings to administration, library, lecture halls, seminar rooms, an immense students' hostel, α full-fledged planitarium (given by Mr. Williams, who attends services at the W.S.I.S. when he spends a few months in New York periodically) and more and more and more.

I enjoyed this visit to the University very much. The sight of the young men and young women strolling around the campus brought back memories to me of my college days.
