THE PRAYER BOOK

COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

THE "ALEYNU" PRAYER

(Continued)

"SPEEDILY"

If it falls to us to accept the yoke of the Kingdom of G-d, we pray that it may rule over us quickly. The story is told about the old Baron Rothschild. He was met in the street by a poor man, who needed a fair sum of money. The Baron was duly impressed, but did not have such a sum with him in cash. He took off his watch, and said to the poor man, "Here is my watch, sell it, and turn it into cash." The poor man replied, "Dear Baron, I will call at your office tomorrow, and then you will give me the money". "Oh no", said the Baron, "Take it now, for tomorrow I may change my mind." When it comes to accept the yoke of G-d, to do a good deed, do it SPEEDILY and do not postpone it, lest you may change your mind. How true this is when an appeal is made. If we answer promptly, the good deed is surely performed. When we say, "We will think it over," we give a very small contribution, or nothing at all.

"AND HIS NAME ONE"

Not that we have two names for G-d, namely אֲדֹנֵי which we use instead of יהוה. The proper name of G-d is called the TETRAGRAMATON, יהוה the 4 letter name of G-d, which we do not pronounce, because we are not holy enough. The Malbim says the time will come, when the world will be better and we will pronounce יהוה the proper name of G-d. Then we will not have to employ all His attributes and names. They will all be ONE, — HIS NAME shall be ONE.

"FROM SUDDEN FEAR"

A fear that something bad will happen. (See Talmud Megillah). We should not be afraid but trust in G-d, that all will be well.

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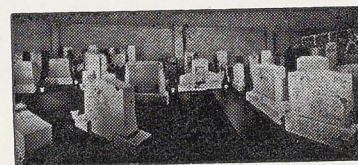
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**AN INVITATION FROM OUR
