

COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

Special Psalm Read In The House Of A Mourner

Psalm 49 (Continued)

"MAN THAT IS IN GLORY, BUT WITHOUT UNDERSTANDING, IS LIKE THE BEASTS THAT PERISH"

One who has great wealth but does not understand his responsibilities is like the poor animal.

The story is told of the person who walked to another city to become rich. On the way he found some good looking stones and put them in his bag. After a day he was famished and asked a passer-by to give him some food. The passer-by consented and asked for all but a few of the precious stones that were in the bag. When the man returned to the town, he left his few belongings with his wife and went to the Synagogue to pray. The wife emptied the bag and found the few precious stones and ran to sell them and bought with them some fine dainties. When he came back and beheld the difference in his home, he fainted and when revived he said, "I could have been such a wealthy man." The moral is, these stones had no meaning for him. So too is it true with the average person. He can receive so much wealth of bliss from his religious practices both here and hereafter, which he regards as of little value. He is also like an animal who has great treasures on his back, but does not enjoy them. So many of us have great treasures, but they are like on our back, we do not use them.

Thirteen Principles of The Faith

Doctrines have been evolved from the Torah as bases for our beliefs. Maimonides summed them up in 13 principles, which we shall now discuss. Joseph Albo summed them up in three, the Existence of G-d, Revelation, Reward and Punishment; David in 7, see Psalm 15; Micah in 3; see Micah chapter 6, verse 8; and Habakuk in one, in chapter 2, verse 4, "And the righteous shall live by his faith."

The Rabbis in the Talmud also selected some teachings of the Torah as basic. Hillel chose "And thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself", Leviticus chapter 19, verse 18. Akiba and Ben Azzai debated this question. Akiba chose, "And thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself," while Ben Azzai chose, "This is the book of the generations of MAN", (Genesis chapter 5, verse 1), not black, nor white, nor yellow, nor brown, nor Pagan, nor Hebrew, but MAN. Some of our teachers have held that the 10 commandments are the basis of our faith. However, as doctrines, Maimonides' compilation is the most popular.

"I FIRMLY BELIEVE THAT THE CREATOR, BLESSED BE HIS NAME, IS BOTH CREATOR, AND RULER OF ALL CREATED BEINGS, AND THAT HE ALONE IS THE ACTIVE CAUSE OF ALL THINGS: WHETHER PAST, PRESENT OR FUTURE."

The greatness of G-d's creations is that in all His creatures, there are no two of them that look exactly alike. They are all different.

We have here as First Principle, the belief in the existence of G-d, as Creator, and Ruler of all Creation,—past, present and future.

First of all the notion of the existence of G-d has been expressed by all Mankind and has led not only to Monotheism, but to Polytheism, Pantheism, and Deism as well. It has come to us as Jews in three ways,—1) Through natural religion, 2) through philosophy and 3) through Revealed Religion. You and I experience a buoyant majestic awe, an inspired feeling, as we reach the top of a high majestic mountain and see all nature laying in front of us. We exclaim, in some fashion, "Oh how great is the work of G-d!" The Psalmist put it this way—"The heavens declare the glory of G-d and the firmament tells of the work of His hands." But all these exclamations are the outbursts of occasional personal exhilarated feelings,—which, as a rule, are fine, excellent in themselves, but do not lead us anywhere, but at best in mystic emotion.

SIYUM CELEBRATION A MEMORABLE EVENING

The celebration by Rabbi Pekier's Talmud Class of the Siyum of "Mesichta Nedarim" on Wednesday night, May 21st, will remain in the memories of those who attended it for a long time to come. It was in the best tradition of the famous Lithuanian Yeshivas which were unfortunately destroyed by the infamous Nazis. It proved again that the West Side Institutional Synagogue is a true link in the chain of

Orthodox Jewry.

From the moment that Rabbi Reichel, the chairman of the celebration, made his opening remarks, to the closing words by Vice-President Samuel W. Siegel, the whole evening was permeated with Torah in the form of Pilpul, Drash, and Halacha. Rabbi Pekier's Hadron was a masterful discourse in two parts consisting of a sharp witted pilpul and a philosophic sermon on Nedarim. His pilpul was so brilliant that some of the listeners gasped at the marvellous exposition of logic. Rabbi Garfiel followed him with a fine dissertation on one of the Agadas in the Mesichta and the lessons to be drawn from it. Mr. Israel Kestenbaum, who spoke next, gave an excellent exposition of the general difference between Mesichta Nedarim and some of the other tractates of the Talmud.

All in all, the evening left a lasting impression on all those who at-

tended it.
