FAST OF TAMMUZ 17

Shiva Aser B'tammuz falls this year on the Sabbath and the Fast is therefore postponed to the next day, **Sunday, July 6.** This day recalls many sad events in Jewish History. One was the breach made in the walls of Jerusalem that led to the destruction of the Temple.

The 17th of Tammuz is also the beginning of a period of semi-mourning which concludes on Tisha

B'av, a duration of three weeks..

Rosh Chodesh Av, Friday, July 18, is the first day of the "Nine Days." Meat may be had only on the Sabbath.

TISHA B'AV

The ninth of Av falls this year on a Sabbath and is therefore postponed to the following day, **Sunday July 27.** Tisha B'av is considered

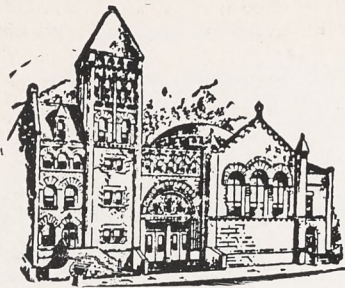

COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

THIRTEEN PRINCIPLES OF THE FAITH

Principle I (Continued)

There are also the philosophical arguments leading us to the existence of G-d, as for example, the teleological argument, the argument showing that nothing exists accidentally. The table for instance had a maker, and so all things had a designer, a fashioner, a creator. So too, the world must have had a Creator, a "First Cause."

Upon examination of all these arguments we find they help us to stave off skepticism, but do not always establish belief in G-d, thus the Psalmist, who spoke of Natural Religion,—as "the heavens declaring the glory of G-d", continues and indicates that there is another, a sure method chosen by G-d, by which fixity and certainty are obtained, namely, through Revelation,—in the words "the Revelation (the Law) of the Lord is perfect, it satisfies the soul."

What then does Revelation make of our conception of the Deity? It indicates that He is not only the First Cause, the Creator of heaven and Earth, but He is also in His essence of Creator, the "Manhig," "the Ruler," the one who superintends, as it were, what He has created. In other words, He has not merely been the Father of the Universe and then allowed it to roll out of His hands, as we do, when we send the ball down the bowling alley. G-d did not let the Universe roll out of His hands and say "Go down and smash"!! We declare in our morning prayers, "He renews the work of Creation, every day in His goodness." We thus observe the world, ruled, and regulated in accordance with his FIXED laws of Creation.

WHERE ARE YOU GOING TO PRAY FOR THE HIGH HOLY DAYS?

The High Holy Days, the most solemn religious festivals in our calendar, have now become both social and secondary in the minds of our very best people. The hotels are crowded. The marvelous inspirational spirit that used to hover over the average Jewish home is now lost in a hotel service which can never supplant the holiness and the dignity of a Synagogue.

Now is the time for us to urge our people to do some thinking as to their obligations to their family and to their neighborhood Synagogue. The Synagogues of New York depend largely for their maintenance upon the income from their seats, which today becomes smaller because of the exit of so many who pray at these hotels, but do not PAY for their seat at the Synagogue, nor make a proper contribution for its upkeep. If one, for reasons of health, has to leave New York for the High Holy Days, it is of utmost importance that they should not forget their responsibilities to their Congregations.

May we advise you to make your reservations now for seats, at any one of the three services in our Synagogue.
