## THE PRAYER BOOK

COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

## THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

"And God spake all these words, saying,

I am the Lord thy God, which have brought thee out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage." (Exodus Chapter 20, verses 1 and 2).

It is only in the Jewish version that we find this as the first of the Ten Commandments. The non Jewish Bibles of course may not print this as their commandment because they were not taken out of the land of Egypt which is part of the historic foundation of this commandment. The Ten Commandments are the ten sledge-hammers of morality.

"I AM THE LORD THY GOD WHO BROUGHT THEE OUT OF THE LAND OF EGYPT OUT OF THE HOUSE OF BONDAGE."

It is interesting to note that the consciousness of God is not urged upon us as a matter of belief but rather as a matter of knowledge or experience. Our Rabbis point out the fact that if the commandment read, "I am the Lord thy God who created heaven and earth," instead of "who brought thee out of Egypt," consciousness of God would be linked with Creation and we would have to accept God on faith, but since the story of Egypt is referred to, it is no longer a matter of hearsay but rather an actual historical happening which was witnessed and experienced by at least three million souls. Furthermore, the story of creation would only tell us that there was a Creator, or a Supreme cause, but not that there is an Omniscient Introspecting Judge of human affairs. One who also bestows the spirit of prophecy upon mortals so as to have intercourse with humanity and inform it of His wish and pleasure. All these things were evidenced in God's dealings with Egypt and in the redemption of Israel through Moses.

Some of our Rabbis say that God sent prophets to the Gentile world offering them the Ten Commandments before he offered them to Israel. The commandments were first offered to the children of Esau who rejected them on account of the injunction, "Thou shalt not kill." "Our very existence and civilization are dependent upon the sword," said they. "How can we accept such a prohibition?" Next the commandments were offered to the children of Ammon and Moab, who objected to them because of the provision "Thou shalt not commit adultery;" since their very origin was an adulterous one and their whole social ethics were based upon adultery. Surely, then they could not be recipients of the Ten Commandments. Then the prophet who was entrusted with the commandments wended his way to the sons of Ishmael who found it impossible to accept them on account of the injunction "Thou shalt not steal," for their very existence was dependent upon theft. So it was that they all refused to accept the commandments except Israel, whose code of morality even before it received the commandments was far superior to that of its neighbors.
