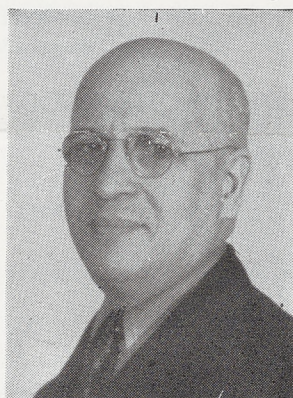

COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

(Continued)

The Second Commandment

THOU SHALT HAVE NO OTHER GODS BEFORE ME.

THOU SHALT NOT MAKE UNTO THEE ANY GRAVEN IMAGE, OR ANY LIKENESS OF ANY THING THAT IS IN HEAVEN ABOVE, OR THAT IS IN THE EARTH BENEATH, OR THAT IS IN THE WATER UNDER THE EARTH:

THOU SHALT NOT BOW DOWN THYSELF TO THEM, NOR SERVE THEM: FOR I THE LORD THY GOD AM A JEALOUS GOD, VISITING THE INIQUITY OF THE FATHERS UPON THE CHILDREN UNTO THE THIRD AND FOURTH GENERATION OF THEM THAT HATE ME; AND SHOWING MERCY UNTO THOUSANDS OF THEM THAT LOVE ME, AND KEEP MY COMMANDMENTS.

"THOU SHALT HAVE NO OTHER GODS BEFORE ME." The original Hebrew lends itself also to the following rendering: "Thou shalt have no gods of others," etc. The Rabbis explain this to mean that we should not serve idols just because others do so. In the Mechilta the Tanaitic Midrash on the Book of Exodus upon the words **אלהים אחרים** other gods, we have the following comment:

"Are they godly? Has it not been said they are not gods? But (the answer is) others give them the godhead."

"AM A JEALOUS GOD VISITING THE INIQUITY OF THE FATHERS UPON THE CHILDREN UNTO THE THIRD AND FOURTH GENERATION OF THEM THAT HATE ME." The Rabbis say that descendants suffer only if they are wicked and embrace the sins of their ancestors, otherwise they are immune.
