COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

#### THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

#### The Second Commandment

THOU SHALT HAVE NO OTHER GODS BEFORE ME. THOU SHALT NOT MAKE UNTO THEE ANY GRAVEN IMAGE, OR ANY

LIKENESS OF ANY THING THAT IS IN HEAVEN ABOVE, OR THAT IS IN THE EARTH BENEATH, OR THAT IS IN THE WATER UNDER THE EARTH:

THOU SHALT NOT BOW DOWN THYSELF TO THEM, NOR SERVE THEM: FOR I THE LORD THY GOD AM A JEALOUS GOD, VISITING THE INIQUITY OF THE FATHERS UPON THE CHILDREN UNTO THE THIRD AND FOURTH GENERATION OF THEM THAT HATE ME; AND SHOWING MERCY UNTO THOUSANDS OF THEM THAT LOVE ME, AND KEEP MY COMMAND-MENTS.

"AND SHOWING MERCY UNTO TWO THOUSAND (GENERATIONS) OF THEM THAT LOVE ME, AND KEEP MY COMMANDMENTS." The sages note here the difference between retribution and compensation. In the case of guilt G-d visits punishment upon the descendants up to but not farther than fourth generation, but in the case of merit, reward and compensation are extended as far at least, to two thousand generations.

#### THE THIRD COMMANDMENT

THOU SHALT NOT TAKE THE NAME OF THE LORD THY GOD IN VAIN; FOR THE LORD WILL NOT HOLD HIM GUILTLESS THAT TAKETH HIS NAME IN VAIN.

Truth will out and God Himself will call the offender to account. It is a vain thing to tell a lie. When nations make treaties and employ God's name, they profane it when they break the treaties.

#### ''PROVIDENCE''

By Rabbi Herbert S. Goldstein

"The belief in Divine Providence negates blind fatalism on the one hand, and self dependence on the other hand.

Divine Providence is not to be confused with luck. According to the Jewish interpretation, the Hebrew word for "luck" is "mazel", the first letters of which, stand for: place, season and work. In other words, we believe that luck is based upon being first, properly situated, and then, being in season with the demand, together with hard work.

Providence means that God provides, providing we do our share. He provides food for the birds, but does not drop it into their nests. He rained "manna" for the people of Israel in the desert, but He did not go out and gather it for them. God, as the Psalmists put it, "opens His hands", as it were, to every living thing, but we may not sit by with arms folded and say: "I believe in Providence." We must do our share wholeheartedly, full-souled and mightily. In other words, we must work as if our work alone could gain our end, but pray to God, as if all our work were in vain, without His Divine Providence.

Some people mistake fate for

Providence. Fate implies that whatever happens must be. Providence means that God provides and ordains, what must be. Fate makes us fatalists — blind and resigned. Providence makes us believers, giving us the feeling that all is for the good.
