All ads and greetings which you insert yourself and/or obtain from others will be credited to your Dinner ticket which is \$75. — per person.

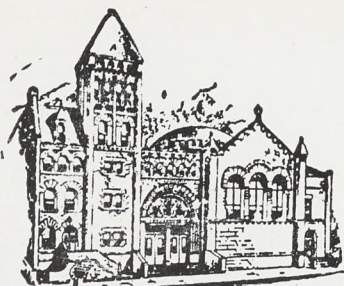
DINNER RESERVATIONS AND ADS COMING IN

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

FOURTH COMMANDMENT

"REMEMBER THE SABBATH DAY, TO KEEP IT HOLY.

SIX DAYS SHALT THOU LABOUR, AND DO ALL THY WORK:

BUT THE SEVENTH DAY IS THE SABBATH OF THE LORD THY GOD; IN IT THOU SHALT NOT DO ANY WORK, THOU, NOR THY SON, NOR THY DAUGHTER, THY MANSERVANT, NOR THY MAIDSERVANT, NOR THY CATTLE, NOR THY STRANGER THAT IS WITHIN THY GATES:

FOR IN SIX DAYS THE LORD MADE HEAVEN AND EARTH, THE SEA, AND ALL THAT IN THEM IS, AND RESTED THE SEVENTH DAY; WHEREFORE THE LORD BLESSED THE SABBATH DAY, AND HALLOWED IT."

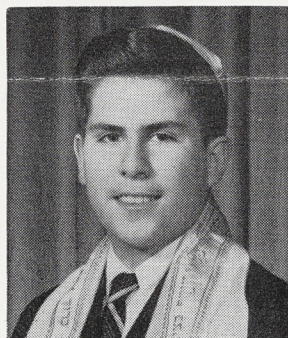
Sabbath observance is ordained in the Ten Commandments.

No deeds of charity, no amount of philanthropy, of gentle heartedness and benevolence can ever atone for the desecration of the Sabbath," says the Hafetz Hayim. For the Sabbath is the heart of Judaism. It is like to a dangerously ill patient being treated by various specialists. Each diagnostician declares that the patient must first attend to the cure of the particular illness, of which he is deemed an expert. Thereupon an old physician arises and addresses his colleagues: "Gentlemen, you must take notice of the fact that the patient is suffering from a very severe heart ailment. Before you do anything, you ought to strengthen his heart, for as long as his heart will be ill other cures would prove futile." "So," the Hafetz Hayim concludes, "all our efforts to cure our people of their spiritual illness will prove vain, as long as the observance of the Sabbath is neglected."

In the Kiddush prayer on Friday evening when we usher in the Sabbath, we invoke it as "a memorial of the creation" and as "a memorial of the Exodus from Egypt." Thus the Sabbath takes on both a universal and a Jewish aspect. It is the Universal law for all mankind, reminding us of the work of Creation, and that God Himself rested on the SEVENTH DAY. It is the national Jewish law, bidding us to remember that over-work is to be abhorred by the Jew, as we read, "That thy manservant and maidservant may rest as well as thou. And remember that thou wast a servant in the Land of Egypt."
