COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

FOURTH COMMANDMENT

(Continued)

To the unthinking, the injunction forbidding us to telephone, to push the electric button, to ride, to hold money on the Sabbath, should be annulled in these modern times. "These restrictions," says Chief-Rabbi Hertz, "justify themselves in that the Jew who actually and strictly obeys these injunctions, and only such a Jew, has a day of rest." Such a Jew not only rests, but is free from the strain, from the nerve-racking week-day grind.

Now let me pay the deserved tribute to the Sabbath observing Jew. Our sages say, "Can there be any greater hero, than the man who knows that while he is in the Synagogue on Saturday or the Festivals, his competitor's place of business is open and his is shut?

"Who are the mighty:" our Rabbis ask. They answer in the words of the 103 Psalm, "They are mighty who carry out His commandments." To those of you who observe the Sabbath properly, I extend my admiration. To those who have missed the blessings of the Sabbath, but who would like to learn to enjoy its beneficence I take this means of humbly offering you my instruction and guidance.

I want to deal now with the "Vah-yin-naw-fash" or the spiritual side of the Seventh Day. The Hebrew word "Vah-yin-naw-fash" which may be translated "refreshed," is derived from the word "nefesh" soul, and is used only in connection with human beings and not with animals. The weary beast is simply to rest, — that is all it can get from its Sabbath; but the servant and the stranger, all men, are to secure in addition that higher, that spiritual refreshment which rest may afford them the opportunity. Thus when in the second chapter of Genesis the Almighty is described as finishing the work of Creation, the same expression is applied to Him. He is said, figuratively, of course, to be "refreshed," to know the spiritual joy which the Sabbath is designed to yield to His human children.

The Sabbath truly lived, is man's recreation. It is his RE-creation physically and spiritually. Too many go to work the day after their Sabbath with the proverbial "blue Monday" feeling. Why? Because they spend their Sabbath entirely in physical pursuits, and thus the next day they are tired, fatigued, and "blue." They really need another Sabbath for recuperation.

"A Sabbath well spent, Brings a week of content."

The Sabbath is the keystone of Judaism. Take away the keystone, and the rest of the structure will totter.

I am frequently asked, "Is it permissible to attend this or that function on the Sabbath? May I attend this or that game on the Sabbath? My answer invariably is that one may, within the letter of the law, but I ask is it within the spirit of the law and in keeping with the Sabbath, to attend or participate in this or that secular activity? "Participation in secular activities on the Sabbath is like the sudden intrusion of a shrill street-organ on a beautiful melody sung by a lovely voice."

Now we shall discuss in detail the words of the Sabbath Commandment.
