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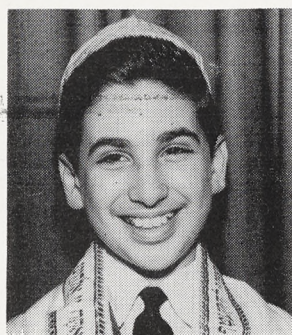

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

FOURTH COMMANDMENT

(Continued)

Now we shall discuss in detail the words of the Commandments זכור "REMEMBER THE SABBATH DAY." The Rabbis say this means that one should have forethought during the week so that Sabbath desecration should not face him suddenly and become unavoidable. If one orders goods, for instance, he should try to arrange that they should not be delivered on a Sabbath or on a Festival. The Sabbath is so holy that it becomes part and parcel of the Jew every day. We close our daily prayers on Sunday by saying "to-day is the first day of the Sabbath," and then read a Psalm. On Monday we conclude, "This is the second day to the Sabbath," etc., and on Saturday we say, "To-day is the holy Sabbath."

שמור "BE CAUTIOUS", "keep", "take heed or guard" refers to the negative side of the commandment, namely that one should not desecrate the Sabbath with any of the thirty-nine subdivisions of the term "work". The negative side also includes doing anything which has the semblance of a week-day activity. The observance of the Sabbath is incomplete if we fail to live up to either the positive or the negative side of the injunction. The Rabbis tell us that זכור "Remember" and שמור "Guard" were declared simultaneously.

"TO SANCTIFY IT." This is done through the Kiddush Service over a cup of wine in the Synagogue and in the home when the Sabbath is ushered in. The Rabbis further instituted the Kiddush (Sanctification) before every meal on the Sabbath.

"SIX DAYS SHALT THOU LABOR AND DO ALL THY WORK." The Rabbis interpret this to mean that when the Sabbath arrives one should be "free of care" as if all his work has been finished. The Sabbath should find one in a mood as care-free as that of the first man in the Garden of Eden, so that he can leisurely concentrate upon G-d and His Torah.

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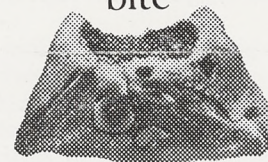
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
