THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

FOURTH COMMANDMENT

(Continued)

THAT THY MAN-SERVANT AND THY MAID-SERVANT MAY REST AS WELL AS THOU". This sentence is absent in the first decalogue in Exodus because in the first decalogue the command for the Sabbath is personal, and here it refers to the employees and the animals.

"AND REMEMBER THAT THOU WAS A SERVANT IN THE LAND OF EGYPT, AND THAT THE LORD ETC., BROUGHT THEE OUT THENCE", ETC. In the decalogue in Exodus, the observance of the Sabbath is given as part of God's plan of creation. In the decalogue in Deuteronomy, the observance of the Sabbath is given as a boon from slavery. Therefore we are reminded of, our bondage in the departure from Egypt. Thus, rest for our employees is made imperative and incumbent upon us. This commandment also bids us to give rest on the Sabbath to the animal kingdom as well.


