

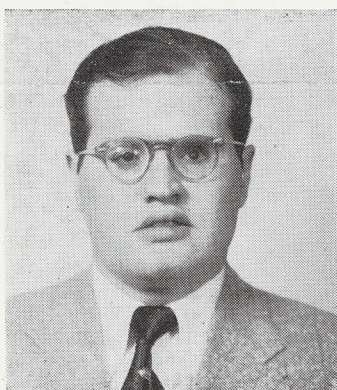

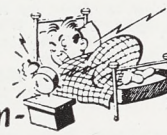

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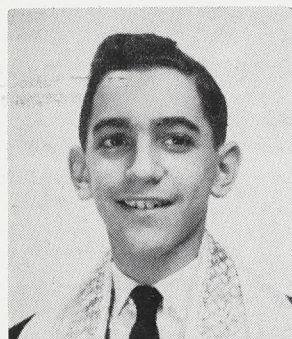

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

FOURTH COMMANDMENT

(Continued)

"NOR THY STRANGER THAT IS WITHIN THY GATES." The Rabbis have it "NOR thy convert." However, a Gentile, even though he had settled in the land of Israel, when Israel controlled legislation, was not to be interfered with, if he wanted to work on the Sabbath. He is only expected to observe the seven commandments given to the sons of Noah, but Sabbath rest and the other commandments are not binding upon him, for the Bible says "It is a sign between Me and the Children of Israel forever" (Exodus Chapter 3 Verse 17). Only he who has been converted to our faith is expected to observe the Sabbath. How much more broadminded and tolerant this is than Christian Sabbath legislation which deals with the same subject in many of our states, including our own New York State.

"WHEREFORE THE LORD BLESSED THE SABBATH DAY AND HALLOWED IT." "Blessed the Sabbath" implies that God's blessings provide during the preceding days what is needed for the Sabbath just as he did in the case of the manna. But the hallowing of the Sabbath implies that on the Sabbath day itself nothing is to be provided. The Rabbis say that "He who does not prepare on the eve of the Sabbath has nothing to eat on the Sabbath." Once again we can refer to the case of the manna as an illustration of this principle. This saying of the Rabbis may also be interpreted metaphorically to mean that this world is like the eve of Sabbath, which must be utilized to prepare and provide ourselves with good deeds and acts of merit. The world to come is like the Sabbath, the enjoyment of which depends upon what we have prepared for ourselves here on earth.
