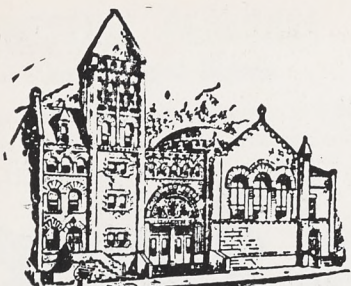
HEBREW SCHOOL NOTES

THE PRAYER BOOK

COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

Evening Service

(Continued)

"MANY A TIME HE TURNETH AWAY HIS ANGER"

This is a reference to the past. We say that G-d has withheld His wrath many a time. (The Bible is replete with such incidents). Now we pray, that in the future, He may again withhold His anger.

"ALL HIS WRATH"

We pray to G-d, that if He does show His wrath, it should be little by little and not ALL AT ONE TIME.

"BLESS YE THE LORD"

This would be sufficient without adding **המברך** WHO IS TO BE BLESSED. The reason for this addition is that if the Cantor called upon the congregation "Bless Ye the Lord", it might only refer to the congregation and not to the reader himself. Therefore **המברך** "Who is to be blessed" by ALL, was added to include the reader.

"BRINGEST ON THE EVENING"

This should be translated in the plural, "THE EVENINGS", namely, 1) the sunset, and 2) when the stars appear.

"CHANGEST THE TIME AND VARIEST THE SEASONS"

What is different between TIMES and SEASONS? The word "TIME" does not refer to a specific date. G-d sometimes makes the summer cool, and the winter warm. Thus we say here "changest the time." But the word "SEASON" refers to a specific date or time as a loan for a specific time, or every day, becomes night, — a specific time.

"THOU CREATEST DAY AND NIGHT"

Was this not done at CREATION? The answer is whilst it is true of course that day and night were created at creation, but EVERY DAY and NIGHT are created afresh.

"THOU ROLLEST AWAY THE LIGHT FROM BEFORE THE DARKNESS"

This is one of the great blessings of G-d. In order that our vision should not be hurt, G-d so arranged the day that He "rolls away the day", gradually from lesser light to great light, and then gradually to evening and then to night (See my Bible comments on Gen. 8:22)

"HE MAKEST TO PASS"

(1) not "And he removed." In other words, G-d causes it to pass from one place to another. (3) All this gives us a thrill every day as we consider G-d's wondrous daily re-Creation. (2) When it is noon in the United States, it is evening or night in Israel, etc. This has been described as "the workshop of the Almighty" (2).

"WITH EVERLASTING LOVE"

This expression is to be found in Jeremiah chapter 31 verse 2. With everlasting love G-d gave us the Torah. Therefore the Torah must be for our good. It is our light, "for in Thy light, we shall see light", (Psalm 36 verse 9). Only by the light, which emanates from G-d, are we able to perceive, the more exalted purposes of living, and it is "our life, and length of day" . . . "your days may be multiplied, and the days of your children upon the land, which the Lord swore unto your fathers to give them as the days of the heavens, above the earth." (Deuteronomy chapter 11 verse 21).

"AND THOU SHALT LOVE THE LORD THY G-D"

How can we legislate emotion, and reach that highest stage in love? The answer is one must commune, one must work upon himself until he becomes elevated to that level, that all his acts are an effluence of His love of G-d.

ISRAELI DIARY OF MRS. HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

(Continued)

Thursday, June 5, 1958

I am writing this as I am sitting in my wheelchair, in my "ringside seat" right near the out door platform at the Israel 10th Anniversary Exhibition, in Jerusalem.

After being indoors for two days resting up after my trip to Sdeh Chemed, the WSIS Children's Village, I decided to step out this evening. It is the official opening of the Israel Tenth Anniversary Exhibition. When we got to the exposition grounds we were faced by a series of steps and I said to Dad: "I'll go back in the taxi and you stay here to see the exhibition". But in a jiffy several strong and helpful men carried me up chair and all, not only that, but I got a "ringside seat" and was better off then anybody else, because I could sit while everybody else had to stand throughout the program.

There was an orchestra of several hundred men and women.

Thunderous applause! Ben-Gurion has just come in!

Ben-Zvi has just arrived! Some more thunderous applause. Now they are singing the Hatikva — the national anthem — lead by a chorus of several hundred young people on the platform. The ten thousand visitors to the exhibition join in, almost as one, and their voices, full of heartfelt enthusiasm ringing out into the night air is powerfully stirring.
