THE PRAYER BOOK

COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

Psalm 126

"A SONG OF ASCENTS"

This and the fourteen other Psalms of Ascents are described as the Songs of the Ascents. In the Mishnah (Succah 2:5), describing the Temple we read "Fifteen steps led up from within it (THE PLACE FOR THE WOMEN) to the place FOR THE MEN, the Israelites, corresponding to the 15 Songs of the Ascents in the Psalms. Upon them (the Ascents or Steps) the Israelites used to sing. So also at the Rejoicing Ceremony of the "Drawing of Water" on Succos, the Levites stood on these steps and sang. (See Mishnah Succah 5:2)

"IN THE LORD'S RETURN TO ZION".

In our Daily and Festival Prayers, we repeat 3 times — morning, afternoon and evening — "Blessed Art Thou oh God, who will cause His Shechina to return to Zion", thus we pray not merely for the PHYSICAL return and rebuilding of Jerusalem, but for the return of the Schechina — G-d's presence. Would that our Nationalist-Zionists per se would understand our complete mission in regard to Zion.

"LIKE THEM THAT DREAM".

The joy in returning to Zion is like a dream realized. "THEN OUR MOUTH WILL BE FULL OF JOY". Then when our return will be both a physical and religious one, then we will be "FULL OF JOY".

"THEN SHALL THEY SAY AMONG THE NATIONS: THE LORD HATH DONE GREAT THINGS WITH THESE — WITH US".

Certainly when the Nations will associate G-d, and the great things He has done for us, then all, and not merely a part of our people will fully rejoice. Their joy will not be temporary, but for the world forever. Thus we pray for the coming of the Messiah when all worry and sorrow shall be no more (See Isaiah, Chapter 35, verse 10).

Let me say to my readers: Who dreamed 11 years ago that we were going to be blessed with a State? So also, who knows whether the Messiah is not right around the corner? (See my comment on Maimonides — the 13th Principle).

"TURN OUR CAPTIVITY O LORD"

In other words, turn our captivity from exile to redemption "AS THE STREAMS OF THE NEGEV". It should rather be translated "as the streams in the Negev", meaning we should be refreshed as streams liven up the very dry land of the Negev.

"THEY THAT SOW IN TEARS (or TEARFULLY) SHALL REAP IN JOY"

The peasant sows his field tearfully, with great anxiety, but when he is privileged to harvest, the tears are supplanted by joyous singing. In other words, what the Jew suffered in the exile will be turned to untold joy.

"THOUGH HE GOETH ON HIS WAY WEEPING THAT BEARETH THE MEASURE OF HIS SEED"

He is terribly anxious as he goes along dropping the seed. He wonders whether he will even get out the amount he sowed, as we have in the "Aw-vee-nu Mahl-kay-nu" prayer, "Oh, our Father, give Thy people at least what they have invested".

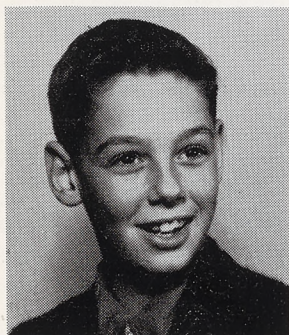

ISRAELI DIARY OF MRS. HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

June 26, 1958

(Continued)

Next we came upon the "Lachish Area" which is composed of 15 to 20 settlements with the city of Lachish as their capital. In the capital are such essentials as a hospital, bank, post office and other communal services which little settlements cannot afford to keep up by themselves. All these settlements have been built within the last 4, 5 and 6 years as a result of the "ship-to-settlement" program. The Jewish Agency provided the land, helped the immigrants get settled and assisted them with the budget for their community.

Many fine roads have been built here to facilitate communication between the different settlements. By means of intensive irrigation, the soil, which is very rich in this neighborhood, has been utilized to produce large crops of many kinds of fruits and vegetables. The houses here are built two-stories high, instead of one, as most houses were formerly constructed. One of these settlements, which is only three years old, has a vast number of houses in it. Before it began to get settled it was all sand, with not even one house in sight.

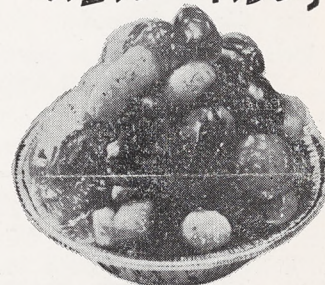
