### The Night Prayer

#### (Continued)

"UPON THE SERPENT THOU SHALT TRAMP" When in unnatural situations thou G-d Himself helps. Why does G-d make it that we should meet such dangerous situations. G-d wants us to realize Him as our helper, and that we should live accordingly.

### "WHEN HE CALLETH UPON ME I WILL ANEWER HIM, I WILL BE WITH HIM IN TROUBLE".

When a person for instance, is sick, and he himself prays it is best. This is the most effective prayer.

Not many but GREAT people, like Saul, Doeg and Abraham. They wanted to kill David.

### BUT THOU O LORD ART A SHIELD ABOUT ME; MY GLORY AND THE LIFTER OF MY HEAD

G-d as a shield protects the body, and an uplifter of the soul.

#### "CAUSE US TO LIE DOWN IN PEACE"

The night when it is dark, we feel more for G-d's protection than we do when it is day. See also above on "Truth and Faith", which we say at night, as over against "True and Firm", which we say in the morning.

#### "GOOD COUNSEL"

At night when we retire, and are about to go to sleep to think quietly about the past and the future, we beg for good counsel."

#### "REMOVE שמי FROM BEFORE AND FROM BEHIND US"

rote as follows: "In the Prayer Book, SATAN is mostly identical with the EVIL IMPULSE, the lower passions which are a hindrance to man's pursuit of the noble aims of life. It is against the dominance of this impulse that the Israelite still prays." Thus we pray that we be saved both from the one, we cannot see, namely the Satanic spirit, or influence, in back of us pushing us to do the doubtful things, or from the one we can see, in front of us, telling us if you are strong enough, you can rise above the group. When amidst the group, again the evil impulse speaks to us and says, as it were "everybody is doing it, why be different?"

Sometimes the Satanic impulse is ahead of us, saying, why participate now in this good deed. An old man in my congregation told me the following story. One wintry morning he awoke early to go to the synagogue for service. Whereupon the Satanic impulse, spoke to him, as it were, in this fashion. Mr. Liss, why get up so early? It's cold out. Go back to sleep. The old gentleman cried out, "You terrible fellow, you can get up early, but you won't let me get up early. Get out of here." Many a time do I think of this story, when attempts are made to prevent me from performing a religious act or a good deed, or acting on a good impulse, or rising for Synagogue Service.
