COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

The Marriage Service

"WHO HAS DISALLOWED UNTO US THOSE THAT ARE BETROTHED." The marriage relationship begins only after the Chupah.

"WHO HALLOWEST THY PEOPLE ISRAEL BY THE RITE OF THE NUPTIAL CANOPY AND THE SACRED COVENANT OF WEDLOCK." The Catholic Church seems to close one eye and permit marriage. The Jewish religion seems to open both eyes and not only sanctions it but sanctifies it. Even the High Priest had to be married.

"BE THOU SANCTIFIED UNTO ME WITH THIS RING ACCORDING TO THE LAW OF MOSES AND ISRAEL."

People speak of the strictness of our Marriage Laws; the Laws of Family Purity etc. We can offer the following observation, "See the effects of the law, when observed properly, among the people of Israel." You will note happy homes, goodly families, and few divorces. Israel in its home life is sanctified because of its Laws of Marriage.

"WITH THIS RING." The ring must have value and be easily recognized that it has worth. That is the reason why we do not permit diamond rings because the bride cannot be sure whether the stone is diamond or glass. Gold has its carat number on the back of the ring. Furthermore, the ring is to be round without a break, symbolic of the harmony and smoothness of the coming wedlock. It is round also, again as a symbol, that there may be no break in the marriage, and that it may last, as the Prophet Hosea put it, "And I will betroth thee unto Me forever," Hosea, Chapter 2: Verse 2. Carrying further the thought of the prophet, I should like to advise all married people to act the way they acted when they were engaged. Then they said the nicest things to each other. Then they were most thoughtful of each other, brought gifts, telephoned to each other and gave evidence of all expressions of love and consideration. G-d, Himself, in wanting to describe His loving relationship to Israel, described it in the marriage betrothal state, as the Prophet Hosea, whom we just quoted, said, speaking in the name of G-d, "And I will betroth thee unto me forever."

Purim

It is obligatory upon men, women, and children to listen to the reading since they all shared in the deliverance described.

It is customary to give the equivalent of three half-shekels for charity before the reading of the Megillah. This year, of course, these coins should be given on Sunday morning.

Special Prayers

The prayer of ``al ha-nisim'' is said during the Purim Prayers. Hallel, the usual psalm of praise, is not read since the Megillah serves as a substitute for the Hallel in praising the work of G-d.
