THE PRAYER BOOK

COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

The Selichos Service

"G-D, THE KING, WHO SITTETH ON THE THRONE OF MERCIES."

Originally, G-d created the world to be ruled by justice. However, for the good of mankind, He ruled with mercy, and is pictured as sitting on the Throne of Mercies. At first we find, in the opening verse of the Bible, the word "Elohim", meaning the G-d of Justice. Later, we find the term "Adonai", which represents the G-d of Mercy, as we find Abraham saying, "Adonai Elohim", "The L-rd G-d, what shalt Thou give me".

"WHO COMFORTS HIMSELF WITH CHASIDUS." He shows his "Chasidus", His "loving-kindness", by giving Man more than he deserves. For when he sins and truly repents, and shows amends, he is forgiven.

"HE PASSES OVER THE FIRST, FIRST." Rashi, in the Talmud Rosh Hashana, says that if G-d sees that both the sins and merits are equal, He removes or forgives at least one sin putting man's merits, thereby, in the majority.

Another comment has it, that if one commits a sin and does not repeat it G-d is "mah-ah-vir". He overlooks it, for the present, and sees how He will act later.

"HE INCREASES PARDON FOR THE SINNER."

G-d completely forgives us for the "Chah-taw-im", "the sins", which are committed unwittingly.

"AND FORGIVES THE 'POSH-I-IM'." The "Posh-i-im" are those who sin purposely or with intent. As for instance, when there are two restaurants, side by side, one a Kosher one and one a "Trefa" one, and he knowingly goes into the "Trefa" one, he is called a "Po--shay-ah" he is forgiven, but not completely, until he repents a great deal and promises to do better next time.
