Passover Holiday **Begins Monday Eve**

The eight-day Passover festival begins this Monday evening. Preparations for this important event of the Jewish calendar must be made well in advance and we reprint reminders regarding these preparations below.

Sale of Chametz

The sale of chametz must be completed by Monday morning at 10:20 A.M. Elsewhere in the Review the coupon which may be used for this purpose appears. It must be in the hands of our Rabbis before Monday morning. The sale may also be arranged by contacting Rabbi Pekier in person in the Synagogue.

Seder Reservations

Final reservations for our Congregational Sedorim, on Monday and Tuesday evenings, may still be made in the Synagogue office. The price is \$11 per person per Seder. This includes all fees, charges and gratui-

"Only if we can boast of 100% participation," Mr. Zucker said, "can this dinner be considered a success for our congregation. We owe this participation to ourselves, to our congregation, and to our Man of the Year, President Lester Udell."

Mr. Zucker added that each year our congregation has had an effort on behalf of a Man of the Year. This year, the same effort to obtain greetings and ads has a double purpose in that it will enable those who obtain these ads to attend the Dinner as well. THE PRAYER BOOK

COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN Selichos Service

In the "Ethics of the Fathers", Chapter 5, Mishnah 2, upon the words there were ten generations from Adam to Noah to make known how longsuffering G-d is, seeing that all those generations continued provoking him until he brought upon them the waters of the flood. Upon this I have the following comment in my book, "The Ethics of the Fathers": "Man should not despair at what seems to be a delay in punishment. It is the unfolding of G-d's attribute of being long-suffering."

"ABOUNDING IN LOVING KINDNESS." He always makes the good we do overbalance the bad. Human beings, however, generally act in the reverse.

"G-D PAYS US FOR THE GOOD WE DO." Earthly government, the government of man, punishes for wrong doings, but does not reward us for the good we do.

"AWVOHN," "INIQUITY." This refers to the sins that we commit because the right path is inconvenient, as for instance, if there's no Kosher restaurant at hand, we will not go out of our way to seek one at a great distance.

Kashering Facilities

Public kashering facilities for the preparation of those utensils which may be used for Passover will be available in the Synagogue this Sunday April 10, from 10 A.M. to 2 P.M. In addition, our Rabbis will be available in the Synagogue for consultation in connection with Passover preparation.

Shabbos Hagadol

On the afternoon of this Sabbath it is customary to read a part of the Passover Haggadah. It is also customary for the Rabbi to give a "Shabbos Hagadol Drasha." Rabbi O. Asher Reichel will give this Halachic Discourse tomorrow afternoon.

Search for Leaven

The search for leaven or "Bedikas

Chometz" should be conducted this Sunday night, April 10th, in the early hours of the evening, preferably right after sunset, with the aid of a candle. The appropriate blessing and "Kol Chamira" should be recited. The blessing may be found in the Haggada or in the Machzor. The crumbs thus collected should be burned Monday morning not later than 10:20 A.M.

Fast of the First Born

Every male first born should fast on Erev Passover, in thankfulness to G-d for having spared the first born of the Israelites when he smote those of the Egyptians. One may, however, forego the fast if he participates in the customary "Siyum Bechorim" which takes place right after the Morning Services on Monday. Consult our Prayer Schedule for the time most convenient for you.

Sale of Chometz For Passover

The sale of chometz in one's possession is a required preparation of every person for the Passover holiday. Our Rabbi Pekier will be available in the Synagogue for this purpose. If you wish, you may use this coupon to make the authorization. It should reach the Synagogue not later than Monday morning, April 11, at 10 A.M.


