THE PRAYER BOOK

COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

HALLEL (Cont'd)

"FOR THY LOVING KINDNESS AND FOR THY TRUTH'S SAKE." We pray that G-d may answer either because of HIS LOVING KINDNESS OR 2) because of His TRUTH, referring to the promise G-d made to Abraham that we shall be his people, (See Genesis Chapter 12 verse 2 and Chapter 13 verse 15) We read in the closing verse of the Book of Micah, "Thou wilt show truth to Jacob and lovingkindness to Abraham according as thou has sworn to our fathers from the days of old "G-d made His promise, out of lovingkindness to Abraham, but Jacob asks it out of TRUTH, namely because it was a promise to Abraham.

עצבים "אינים" THEIR IDOLS ARE GOLD AND SILVER" Which in the end, says the commentator R'oak, (playing upon the root of עצב "sorrow."

"PRAISE YE THE LORD. PRAISE, O YE SERVANTS OF THE LORD." We thank G-d, that we chose to be servants of G-d, and not of a Pharoah.

"HE RAISETH UP THE LOWLY" This and the next two verses are evidences of the Personal G-d interested in the affairs of the individual.

"WHEN ISRAEL WENT FORTH OUT OF EGYPT, THE HOUSE OF JACOB FROM A STRANGE LANGUAGE." The name Israel, always refers to the higher, the more spiritual. It was Israel, the more spiritual type of our people, who were not engulfed in the Egyptian life and who had no affinities with Egyptian culture, they went forthe out of Egypt easily. The others, the rank and file were immersed in the unclean culture of Egypt. They had to break with their ties of language etc.

"JUDAH BECAME A SANCTUARY" This is a reference to Nachson of the tribe, of Judah, who at the Exodus, jumped into the Red Sea, causing it to be split open and permitting the Jews to cross it dryshod. He was the first, at that time to sanctify the name of G-d publicly. In his territory the Sanctuary, the Holy Temple was built. This was his spiritual reward.

"ISRAEL HIS DOMAIN" This is a reference to Nachshon's national reward, namely that all the Kings from David on, hailed from Judah. (not taking into account the rebellion, when the nation was split into the Northern and the Southern Kingdom).

"THE JORDAN" The Mechilta, the Tanaitic Midrash, on the Exodus, commenting on the words, "and the waters were split," tells us that this refers to all the Seas.

"GOLD AND SILVER" The idols are of gold and silver, but they are of no use. We say, "this is a gold ring," but the ring is of use, not so the gold and silver of the idols.

"THEY HAVE MOUTHS, BUT THEY SPEAK NOT; EARS HAVE THEY, BUT THEY HEAR NOT; ETC." It should have read "they do not speak, they do not hear, they do not see," etc. Why the additional words of mouth, ears, eyes, etc. The Maggid of Dubnow explained that these additional words are additional cynicism, namely they are no gods, because they have a mouth, ear, eyes, etc. the organs of mortal beings, and they are lower than man, who can speak, hear, and see etc. which they cannot do.

"YE THAT FEAR THE LORD" This is the highest attainment of man, to fear the Lord. In Psalm 135, the top rung of the spiritual ladder is given to those who fear the Lord, as we read verses 19 and 20 "O house of Israel, bless ye the Lord: O house of Aaron, bless ye the Lord: O house of Levi, bless ye the Lord: ye that fear the Lord, bless ye the Lord."

There are two other very interesting comments. Rashi says that "ye that fear the Lord" refers to the Proselytes, and Ibn Ezra says that it refers to all men of all nations, who fear the Lord.



ONLY THREE WEEKS LEFT IN WHICH TO INSERT A GREETING IN THE SOUVENIR ALBUM TO BE PRESENTED TO OUR PRESIDENT MR. LESTER UDELL

Rabbi Herbert S. Goldstein preaching his sermon on the "Showbread" last Saturday morning, said in part:

"The Showbread was made hollow so that one could look through the bread to the altar without any barrier between them. We in the United States through our State Department should heed the apparent lesson, namely, that economics in a moral climate may not stand between man and his God, between the citizen and justice. The more we reflect, the more we will realize how unthinkable it is that the policy of our State Department has been so pro-Nasser to continue to allow Col. Nasser to flout world opinion and international law by stopping not only Israeli ships, but any steamers passing through the Suez Canal to or from Israel.

One must become cynical when a leader of our Foreign Affairs in the Senate speaks of the economic hurt that would come to us if the Unions continued to boycott the steamship Cleopatra. Let us remember the warning of Scripture, "Man does not live by bread alone." First it was oil that scared us in regard to our relationships with the Middle East. Now it is economics. We have forgotten the motto of our coin, "In God we trust."

Only recently, I received a bulletin from the American Bar Association, calling upon us all to heed the proclamation of President Eisenhower and celebrate May 1st as LAW DAY in our houses of worship and at other public meeting places, "with appropriate ceremonies as a public demonstration of their devotion to the rule of law as the keystone of peace and order in our national and international life."

To give official comfort to the United Arab Republic is hypocritical in the face of the "call" for the observance of national and international law.

The Labor Unions were promised that the State Department will, within a month, use every effort to call a halt against boycotting a segment of our citizenry and our steamers.

It seems to me that those in charge of the Middle East in our State Department may bow their heads in shame when the Labor Unions and not they, are the protagonists for the observance of international law.

I hope and trust that we re-think our foreign policy as it relates to the Middle East. We will be at peace with ourselves if our dominant note is justice and not fear.

May God help those who hold the faith of our future in our State Department, to see clearly through the "Showbread of life" the altar of righteousness and fair-dealing.

HALLEL (Cont'd)

"BECAUSE HE HATH INCLINED HIS EAR UNTO ME" The word און ear is derived from מאונים "Scales". G-d who listens to Prayers, inclines the scale sometimes in our favor.

"IN THE LAND OF THE LIVING" When the Day of Resurrection comes, the dead will become alive first in Israel. Therefore, Eretz Israel is called the "Land of the Living".

See Rashi on Psalm 116.

"I AM AFFLICTED" King David said, "I am an afflicted person" not like other kings, therefore, he could console, and extend sympathy etc. to others.

"WHAT CAN I RENDER UNTO THE LORD, FOR ALL HIS BENEFITS "TO-WARDS ME?" I can do nothing for G-d, says King David. All he can do is to publicly proclaim G-d's name and the goodness he does for us.

"AH LORD, TRULY I AM THY SERVANT, THE SON OF THY HANDMAID" We are not servants, bought as such by someone else, which does not make us supremely loyal. But with King David, do we proclaim, that we are servants from our birth, and loyally and gratefully accept to be a servant of the Lord.

"PRAISE THE LORD, ALL YE NATIONS"

All the nations will Praise G-d for what He has done for Israel, but

"O GIVE THANKS UNTO THE LORD . . . SO LET ISRAEL NOW SAY, THAT HIS LOVINGKINDNESS ENDURETH FOREVER." It remains for Israel to give THANKS.

This is the shortest and yet perhaps the loftiest, when in the Messianic era, in which I believe, we have entered. When the nations will praise G-d for Israel's ultimate revival, and we shall offer our Thanksgiving by becoming soon, I pray "A LIGHT TO THE NATIONS."
