Yom Kippur This Evening



With the solemn and melodious chanting of the ancient awe inspiring and pathos soaked prayer of Kol Nidre, Jews throughout the world will usher in Yom Kippur today at sundown.

The solemn Season of Repentance reaches its highest climax on Yom Kippur. On this day we are not only serious and sincere in our desire to repent but we have the strength of character to continue on the Righteous Path by depriving ourselves of bodily pleasure and life sustaining necessities such as food, drink, washing, and annointing of our bodies; wearing of leather shoes and other earthly pleasures. By "af-

flicting our souls" in this manner from sundown to the evening of the next day we prove that we have the stamina to remain faithful Jews throughout the year.

T'SHUVA, TEFILAH. U'TZDAKAH

To avert an evil decree, our sages tell us, the previous two elements of affliction and charity must be joined by a third force, Prayer. It is for this purpose that we assemble in our Synagogues on Kol Nidre Night and Yom Kippur Day to recite the most solemn and awe inspiring prayers such as "YEALEAH", SOLACHTEE", "AS CLAY IN THE HANDS OF THE POTTER", "L'EL ORECH DIN," "UN-SANEH TOKEF", "THE AVODAH", "ELE EZKERAH", and the closing "NEILAH" service which contain the essence of the Yom Kippur message: "Thou givest a hand to transgressors and Thy right hand is stretched out to receive the penitent. Thou hast taught us, O Lord our G-d, to make confession unto Thee of all of our sins, in order that we may cease from the violence of our hands and may return unto Thee who delightest in the repentance of the wicked."

At this juncture it is worthwhile to stress a cardinal principle of Judaism which is basic to the Day of Atonement. "For transgressions of man against G-d, the Day of Atonement atones, but for transgressions against a fellow man, the Day of Atonement does not atone unless and until he has conciliated his fellowman and redressed the wrong he has done him."

ERUV TAVSHILIN

It is not permissible to cook, bake or prepare food on one day of Yom Tov for the next day or for the Sabbath. Inasmuch as this year the first and last days of Succoth fall on Thursday and Friday (followed by the Sabbath) the ceremony of Eruv Tavshilin should be performed on Erev Succos. The Eruv Tavshilin set aside prior to the Festival, enables the housewife to cook on Friday for the Sabbath.

A matzoh or roll and some cooked food, such as fish, are placed on a plate. The master of the house lifts the plate and recites the following: "Boruch ataw ado — elo-kenu melech ha-olam asher kidsha-nu b'mitzvo-sav v'tzi-va-nu mitzvas e-ruv . . . By virtue of this Eruv, be it permitted to us to bake, cook, keep food warm, light the candles, and do all that is necessary on the Festival for the Sabbath."

On Saturday afternoon the food thus prepared on Wednesday may be eaten.

ABRAHAM M. DRUCKMAN INTERVIEWED BY ONE OF THE W.S.I.S. REVIEW REPORTERS

Joseph Neustadter, son of Mr. and Mrs. Aaron Neustadter, one of the W. S. I. S. Review reporters, graduated from Ramaz High School and then attended Long Island University where he majored in Biology and received his B.S. degree. During the day he is employed at the Mt. Sinai Hospital as a Bacteriologist and at night he attends L. I. U. where he is majoring in Micro-Biology for his Master's Degree.

Our Director, Mr. Abraham M. Druckman traveled through France, England, Switzerland and Austria and spent three weeks in Israel. He has been in Europe 18 times and this was his sixth consecutive trip to Israel.

Question: Is there any change that you can see from year to year?

Answer: Yes, each year there is a remarkable advance over the last year. It is a little country of two million people making an imprint like a country of 200 million people.


O.: What impressed you most?

A.: The people are genuinely happy. They take the constant threat of Arab attack in their stride. The youth of Israel have an attitude of "do or die" which will make Israel succeed.

Q.: What is the Israeli attitude toward Americans?

A.: Very friendly. They realize that without the support of American Jews there probably would be no prosperous Israel.

Q.: Premier Ben-Gurion recently said that Zionist organizations are like a temporary scaffold on a building which must be removed when the

building is completed. Have you any comment?

A.: Ben-Gurion is a great man. He has ideas of his own and is very stubborn. Being human he sometimes makes mistakes.

O.: What are the changes for the establishment of complete orthodoxy in Israel?

A.: The government will never be orthodox. I am orthodox but I am also tolerant. The government should never dominate the religious beliefs of the people but the Torah should prevail. Today, the youth of Israel is the best answer to people who say orthodoxy is diminishing in Israel. Many thousands of young people go to the Yeshivas. The youth of Israel are turning back to orthodoxy.

O.: Would you consider living permanently in Israel?

A.: I would love to go there but my roots are in this country. I can do more for Israel here than I could if I were there.

Mr. Druckman concluded our very interesting discussion with a few remarks about giving help to Israel. He said that there are two main precepts to his philosophy of giving. The first is that he is his brother's keeper. The second is that when the Almighty gives a man more than he can use, it is a trust, to see how this man handles his "extra share." Since this "extra share" is really not his he can use it to help others with a free heart. Mr. Druckman wishes that ever many could feel the joy that comes in giving with a free heart.
