OUR SUCCAH BEAUTIFUL

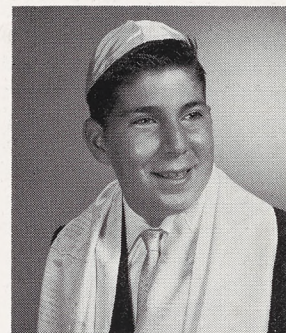
