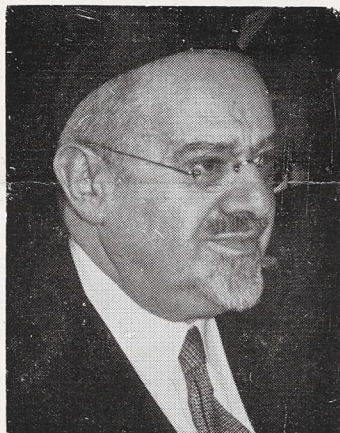

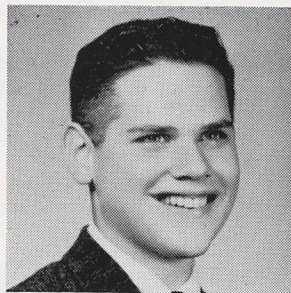

JACOB KAPLAN INTERVIEWED BY ONE OF THE W.S.I.S. REPORTERS

James O. Herlands, son of our Director, Judge and Mrs. William B. Herlands, and grandson of our Women's League Board member, Mrs. Siegfried Bendheim, has for some time indicated his future role as a W. S. I. S. leader. His service as a leader of our Youth Minyon and currently as a W. S. I. S. Review Reporter is but part of his long devotion to the West Side Institutional Synagogue.

Our reporter is a graduate of Manhattan Day School and Columbia Grammar School. At High School, he was Business Manager of his yearbook.

James, now a sophomore at Yeshiva University, is majoring in Economics. He was Editor-In-Chief of the Freshman College Newspaper and now is Editor-In-Chief of the Sophomore College Newspaper and of the affiliated Young Democratic bi-monthly journal.

Q. Mr. Kaplan where did you and your wife travel this past summer?

A. We travelled through France, Portugal and Switzerland.

Q. On your visit to Europe, did you have the opportunity of visiting any synagogues?

A. Yes, I did. I attended services on Shabbos in Lisbon, Cannes, Zurich and Paris.

Q. In the course of your visits to these synagogues, did any one impress you more than the other?

A. I personally liked the synagogue in Cannes more than the others. They have a small, but impres-

sive building. The one in Zurich had the largest attendance of all, but I prefer the Synagogue in Cannes.

Q. Mr. Kaplan, did you enjoy a particular country on this trip?

A. I was extremely impressed by my visit to Portugal. After going to Shul on Shabbos, I had the opportunity of talking with some of the Jewish natives of Portugal. From what I gathered, Judaism is quite difficult to observe from the dietary point of view. It is virtually impossible to obtain kosher meat in Portugal and so the diet of the Portuguese Jew consists mainly of fish and dairy products.

Q. Mr. Kaplan, based on your observations of Jewish life abroad, do you have any suggestions with regard to Jewish life in America?

A. The only recommendations I can make are based on observations formulated in the various synagogues during my visit in Europe. I noticed that these Shuls stress the importance of involving their youth in Shul affairs. The youth always participate in services, and in activities conducted under the auspices of the synagogue. I also noticed that the Shul officials are changed every few years to involve as many capable people in various aspects of Jewish communal life as possible.
