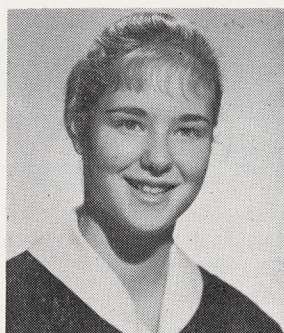

TREASURER AND MRS. SAMUEL SILVER INTERVIEWED BY ONE OF THE W.S.I.S. REPORTERS

Bernice Goldberg is the daughter of our members, Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Goldberg. She is a graduate of Yeshiva University High School for Girls. A freshman at Hunter College, she is majoring in Hebrew. She is affiliated with her school newspaper. Bernice plans to teach after she will graduate.

Our reporter has been a youth leader in our Synagogue and participates in our youth groups.

Question: Mr. and Mrs. Silver, what countries did you have the opportunity to visit this past summer.

Answer: We visited Greece, Italy, Portugal and Israel.

Q: Was this your first trip to Israel? What was your reaction upon entering your Jewish Homeland?

A: This was our first trip. When you enter Israel you don't feel like a tourist. You feel like you are at home. The nicest thing was to see how the young people have built up the land. They work for 48 hours a week and they don't get any money for it. In the common goal, sharing their food, clothing, etc. They don't work for any material gain. There is no fear among these young people. Even though the Arabs can attack at any time, the young people don't worry about dying, because it is their country; it is their dream and they are willing to die for it.

Q: What is the Jewish life like in Israel?

A: We met an Englishman there who was an ardent Zionist and came to Israel to make his home, but he is not orthodox. Yet he

lives a Jewish life because all the Jewish holidays are national holidays and on the Sabbath there is no traffic. He lives and breathes Judaism.

Q: While you were in Israel, did you have the opportunity to visit the W.S.I.S. Children's Village?

A: Yes, we saw the Children's Village and it was stupendous. It is a wonderful thing that was done for the children. Homes were built and the children are given an excellent Jewish education. There are seventeen villages.

Q: What is the Jewish situation in the other countries that you visited.

A: Judaism has no problem of survival in any of these countries. There are Synagogues in all the big cities. The Jews have a very good life in all these countries. Each country has its own culture and we felt comfortable in each of them.

Mr. and Mrs. Silver said that they wouldn't want to settle in Israel or any other country. They are happy in New York and feel that they can do much more for Israel from this end. They said that the future of Judaism lies in Jerusalem and Israel proper. "They won't be licked" was their sentiment. They feel that if more Jews would go to Israel, the U.J.A. would have no difficulties in raising money because these people would realize that the money is being used properly. In summing up, they said that the Mohammedans have a pilgrimage to Mecca every year. So too, the Jew should have a pilgrimage to Israel every year.
