Our young people are reminded that they can come by themselves if their parents cannot join them. Members of our Mr. and Mrs. League will serve as hostesses.



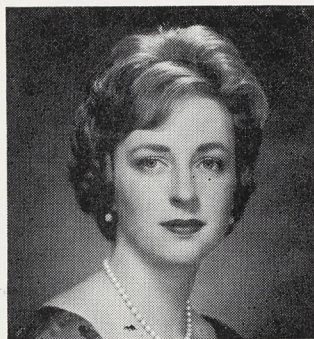

HAGGADAH AND ITS INTERPRETATIONS

Alas, that is the mistake we generally make. Another interpretation is that they became distinguished or recognized by their names, their dress, their morals. We lose our self respect in attempting to become part of the melting pot of the majority.

Great in numbers and strong physically. The Midrash tells us that the Jewish women gave birth to six children at a time. All of them remained alive and grew up strong.

AND NUMEROUS

Israel is compared to nature. Even though there comes the winter which seems to be like death to all vegetation, nevertheless there comes the spring and the rebirth of nature. Israel has been compared to the pheasant that springs reborn from its own ashes.

AND THE EGYPTIANS TREATED US ILL

Another translation may be AND THE EGYPTIANS MADE US AS BAD. Just as the anti-Semites do today. Outside of Russia we are called Communists, in Russia we are called anti-Communists, the anti-Semites the world over call us capitalists, while we are starving under many governments.
