MEN'S CLUB NOTES


The next meeting of our Men's Club will be held on Monday evening, March 27th at 8:30 P.M. Plan to be with us that night.

PASSOVER —

COMMENTS BY RABBI HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

There are **two key words** in the codes which regulate the life of the individual during the Passover week namely Chometz and Matzoh. The Torah explains that the redemption from Egyptian slavery was so sudden, and the Israelite departure so hasty, that they did not have time even to prepare their bread in the usual manner, but they were compelled to bake the dough before it had a chance to ferment. So they rolled the dough into flat cakes and baked them by the heat of the sun. Thenceforth the Israelite was commanded to avoid all Chometz during the Passover week, and to eat Matzoh instead.

Matzoh may be prepared in a prescribed manner from any of the common grain flours, when it contains no ingredients other than flour and water. It is also referred to, as the "lechem oni," the bread of oppression, since it also serves as a reminder of the poor rations on which the Israelite slaves had to subsist during their Egyptian servitude.

Flour from wheat, rye, barley, spelt and oats, are subject to the law of chometz. Contact with water, either in the grain form or after being milled, would render them chometz. During the Passover week, the minutest amount "Ma-shehu" of chometz when mixed with any other food, would render the whole chometz.

To make certain that one does not violate the laws of chometz and matzoh, one should ascertain that the food or beverage to be consumed during the festival has been prepared under strict supervision in keeping with the requirements of Jewish law. Merchants have been known to take advantage of the gullible public by using labels of "kosher le-Pessach" indiscriminately on articles which are pure chometz. One of the members of my Congregation told me that he saw such a label placed on articles which were purely chometz.

All green vegetables and fruits may be used except rice, millet, peas and beans.
