FROM THE ISRAELI DIARY OF MRS. HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

Sunday, June 4, 1960,

Saturday afternoon is always company time, and what a lot of it! Among others were Mr. and Mrs. Brafman, who attend our Synagogue in New York (Mrs. Brafman is a member of the Women's League Executive Board). She said that this visit to Israel was a life time dream realized. Her eyes were sparkling and she spoke about what she had already seen and she seemed imbued with an overwhelming enthusiasm for what she was anticipating.

I wonder if as much is being written in the New York papers as they are writing here about the con-templated trial of Adolph Eichmann, chief assistant of Hitler in the murder of six million of our people. He is described as a "sadistic murderer" who used to visit Auschwitz, Dachau and other death camps frequently. He was captured and brought to Israel for trial.

Ben Gurion says: "In my opinion the importance of the capture of Adolph Eichmann and his trial in Israel lies not in the extraordinary

resources and skill of the staff of Security Services, but in the privilege of having the entire story of the holocaust revealed in the Israel court, so that the facts should be known and remembered by the youth in Israel and so the world, too, should learn the truth."

Eichmann's trial before a Jewish court in Israel may reveal some unpalatable truths to the rest of the world about the unconscionable complacency with which nations watched the great Nazi slaughter. It is interesting to note that the group of police selected to guard Eichmann is composed entirely of SAB-RAS and of policemen coming from countries which were not directly affected by the Nazi regime. None of them speak German.

People in other countries are not pleased about this matter because they are ashamed to have the revelation of the heartless indifference of other people to the hideousness of the crimes which were being performed against the Jewish people during the horrible German holocaust.

HAGGADAH AND ITS INTERPRETATIONS

DAYYENU, WE WOULD HAVE THOUGHT IT ENOUGH

Because of the favors that G-d did for us we became better and better and received more bounteous grace from Him. In the Hebrew, we have the מעלות טובות which means not only grace, but "Grace that is good" or not only favors, but "Favors that are good." Sometimes we may receive gifts which turn out to be harmful rather than for our good, as for instance, parents will lavish gifts upon their children and present them with an automobile which may be the cause of riotous living and harm their children. Thus the gifts do not turn out to be for their good, but for their harm.

HAD G-D ONLY LED US FROM EGYPT AND BROUGHT NO JUDGMENT ON THEIR HORDES

This refers not merely to judgment, but to strict judgment as evidenced by the plagues and the Exodus. From this we learn G-d's might.

AND NOT UNDONE THEIR G-DS.

This shows G-d is Almighty and THE Only ONE.

HAD HE NOT SLAIN THEIR FIRST BORN

This shows G-d's specific or particular Providence. He did not slay the first born of Israel, but only the first born of the Egyptians.

AND HAD HE NOT BESTOWED UPON US THEIR GIFTS

This was to fulfill G-d's promise to Abraham, that his descendants would leave Egypt with great wealth.

HAD HE NOT SPLIT THE SEA FOR US

G-d could have led us around the shorter way, instead He revealed His

HAD HE NOT LED US THROUGH DRY-SHOD

He made the crossing of the Red Sea easy, dry and comfortable for us.

HAD HE NOT PLUNGED OUR FOES THEREIN

Otherwise the Egyptians could have turned back.

HAD HE NOT FILLED OUR NEEDS IN THE DESERT FOR 40 YEARS

G-d provided us with all our needs, as for instance, the Manna which was an easy food to digest and also gave us the taste of savory foods.

HAD HE NOT BROUGHT THE MANNA

Which was a blessing that came from heaven.

HAD HE NOT GIVEN US THE SABBATH

And why was the Sabbath chosen of all the Commandments of the Torah. The answer is because the Sabbath is both the source of physical and spiritual blessing. It is really the centrality of the Torah.

HAD HE NOT GIVEN US THE TORAH

Which is for our good in every way. The Torah is for the soul and Israel is for the body politic of our people.

It is also interesting to note that first G-d gave us the Torah then he led us into Israel. In other words, we are to go or to be in Israel with the Torah. Israel is to be not merely a Refugee Land, — but also a Holy Land.

HAD HE NOT LED US INTO ERETZ YISRAEL

Giving us status and stature.

HAD HE NOT BUILT THEREIN HIS SHRINE

Which was to be our sacred abode for all times. Its purpose is to bring Israel closer to Him. It is a reminder and source for repentance.

AND BUILD FOR US THE CHOSEN TEMPLE FOR EXPIATION OF ALL **OUR SINS**

After all the good that G-d has given us for which we said Dayyenu, would have been enough, our heavenly father, in His goodness, went further and provided something more, namely, the place, the opportunity for forgiveness for all our sins.
