ISRAELI DIARY OF MRS. HERBERT S. GOLDSTEIN

June 13th, 1960

We were very busy Saturday night and Sunday with phone-calls. Dad spoke on the Military Radio Saturday night and it was heard throughout the length and breadth of Israel. He was invited to come to Tel Aviv on Thursday for an interview which was tape-recorded at that time and was heard on the radio on Saturday night. The questions Dad was asked dealt with the cultural and religious life of the people in America and since that is in Dad's line he did very well.

I think I must have told you in previous years of the custom here to give every member of the Minyan at the MAARIV Services on Saturday night a branch of sweet smelling twigs for "HAVDALLAH." If this were done in New York it would be necessary to cut down a forest.

June 16th

Left the house with Dad at 8:30 this morning in a car sent by the UJA to show us some of their many noteworthy accomplishments in Israel.

This Thursday marks the 33nd day of the counting of the Omer and is known as Lag B'Omer. Lag is composed of the two Hebrew letters "lammed, gimmel" which considered as numerals, equal 33.

Lag B'Omer is considered as a minor holiday. Weddings and haircuts are permitted.

Origins of the Celebration

Bar Kochba defeated the Romans on Lag B'Omer in his unsuccessful revolt (132-35 C.E.). During that same period, a plague broke out which raged among the disciples of Rabbi Akiba. On Lag B'Omer the epidemic ceased.

It is also celebrated as the yahrzeit of Rabbi Simeon Bar Yochai, the author of the cabbalistic book "Zohar." In Israel many thousands make the pilgrimage to his grave to pray on this day.

THE PRAYER BOOK

HAGGADAH AND ITS INTERPRETATIONS

MATZOH

THIS UNLEAVENED BREAD WHICH WE EAT — WHAT DOES IT MEAN? BECAUSE THERE WAS NO TIME FOR THE DOUGH OF OUR ANCESTORS IN EGYPT TO BECOME LEAVENED BEFORE THE SUPREME KING OF KINGS, THE HOLY ONE, BLESSED BE HE, REVEALED HIMSELF AND REDEEMED THEM.

Matzoh is the symbol of freedom when G-d freed us from Egyptian bondage. His love toward Israel was so strong that he did not want to tarry and urged them to leave quickly so that they could not have bread made in time, but Matzoh, unleavened bread.

The Dubnow Magid tells a story of a rich man who visited a poor villager who had a brilliant son. He decided to have this brilliant son marry his daughter and immediately he saw to it that they were betrothed and arranged for their marriage. The son said to his father-in-law, "How can we arrange for a marriage? We are not prepared. We only have some poor bread in the house. Give us time to be able to cook and bake and prepare properly." The rich man, being anxious to make sure that nothing would happen to prevent the marriage, said, "That is alright. Do not worry about that," and the marriage ceremony was held. The groom then packed up his clothes that were poor and shabby and put some of the bread of the wedding among them. Some time later the son-in-law had a quarrel with his fatherin-law and the father-in-law then said to him, "Why are you getting so proud?" Do you remember how poor you were when I took you?" The young man went and brought out the bread and said, "Look, I wanted to wait, but you were so anxious to have me that you forced us to use the food that we possessed at that time." So, too, G-d Almighty was zealously in love with us and betrothed us unto Him, as the prophet Hosea put it, "And I will betroth thee unto Me forever," but He did not wait. He forced the Israelites to leave Egypt immediately and all they were able to prepare was the Matzoh.

G-d could have taken the Israelites at a slower pace out of Egypt, but He was so anxious to have them purified from idolatry, that he took them out hurriedly.

Vegan, which is west of Jerusalem. The entire eastern border of Jerusalem is on the Arab front and hence dangerous territory. This accounts for the fact that most of the housing projects and institutions (including the Hadassah Hospital with a capacity for 500 beds, the Hadassah Hebrew University Medical School, Hospital and Nursing School, also the World Academy which is now making rapid progress as far as construction is concerned and looks very impressive and other institutional buildings are all being erected in this section of Jerusalem.

Several interesting things came to our attention on our way home. We saw a crop of Bokshor almost ready for picking. It was nice and soft, nothing like the almost rocky stuff we include in the Tu Bishvat bags.

We saw huge plantations of sunflowers from which oil is extracted and made into margarine.

We came upon flocks of white goats which are now being imported from Switzerland. They are said to be less destructive than the black ones, which the Arabs continue to use. We were told that the black goats tear the roots of trees, stand on their hind legs leaning on the trunks of trees, in order to eat its fruit and pull down its branches.

WSIS CAMPAIGN FOR THE UNITED JEWISH APPEAL

The United Jewish Appeal Committee of the W.S.I.S. has undertaken to participate in the West Side "Adopt-a-Project" program. Shluhot, the agricultural settlement adopted by our Synagogue, is precariously situated in the Afula district of Israel, less than five miles from the Jordanian border. It was founded in 1948 by a determined group of East European immigrants. Even though that was a year of life-or-death crisis for the newly declared State of Israel, with the valiant settlers bearing the brunt of a combined invasion force of nine Arab armies, this hopeful group pushed right out to the eastern rim of the new state and "dug in."

Complete consolidation of Shluhot has long been the anxious hope of its hard working settlers, including 130 children. Today, these people can earn only 70% of what they need to be self-sufficient due to a lack of funds. They need tools, livestock, irrigation materials and other farm equipment.

Our participation will be given recognition in that settlement in the form of a special plaque.

Your presence at our UJA Dinner on Thursday, May 18th, is of vital importance for the life-saving work of the United Jewish Appeal.


